of PUGET AMATEUR RADIO SOCIETY MEETING February 20, 1997

The meeting was called to order by President Al Staples N7VOF.Ten members were present, a quorum. Those present introduced themselves. One guest, Les Ellis KC7TQP was also present.

The minutes of the January 23 meeting were approved as published in SPARKS, Treasurer Chaz Hitz K7NNS reported receipts of \$250.00 so far in dues, expenses of \$157.00 for trailer license, and a current balance of \$965.00. He has not yet paid the contribution approved in November 1996 to the ARRL fund to preserve the 2m-70cm bands because he has been unable to get a proper address from ARRL. Chuck Stroeher stated that it should be sent to the regular ARRL address and marked "Frequency Defense Fund".
