Minutes of the March 5, 2009, Meeting Negaunee, Michigan

Additions were made to the agenda under New Business: Spotter Training and First Aid, New Classes, Dayton Trip, and Weather Service Computers. A motion was made by Bill, KC8EWD, seconded by Norm, KD8BPC, to approve the agenda as amended. Motion passed without dissent.

A motion was made by Rich, N8GBA, seconded by Bill, KC8EWD, to approve the February 5, 2009, meeting minutes. Motion passed without dissent.

Committee Reports:

<u>APRS/Packet/Repeater</u> – Greg, KI8AF, reported APRS is down and Packet is off of the air. Paul, KB0P, noted the repeaters are still working and worked well during the dog sled race. Lou, KG8NK, reported Chippewa County has acquired a 440.900 repeater in Newberry with a 330-foot antenna with which they hope to link to other area repeaters.

<u>ARES/RACES</u> – Lou, KG8NK, announced an emergency drill will be held in June from local County Emergency Operation Centers to the EOC in Lansing. A discussion followed concerning locating ham equipment at the State Police Post. Lou, KG8NK, noted a state grant is being worked on; and MARS is working on an agreement with ARRL.

<u>PR</u> – Lee, KD8BJC, stated notice of tonight's meeting had been submitted to *The Mining Journal* but did not see it. A meeting notice was also submitted to the television station. <u>Swap and Shop</u> – Lee, KD8BJC, reported lots of club members helped out, and things went well. Income from this year's event was down compared to last year mostly due to lower raffle ticket sales.

<u>Sled Dog Race</u> – Lou, KG8NK, noted the race went well for the weather we had and passed around the plaque from the Sled Dog Association given to thank the hams for all their volunteer hours. The sled dog race was listened to by hams all over the world. Paul, KB0P, and Mike, KE8IL, are working on an idea for next year where they will try to stream audio of the race on the sled dog web page.

2009 Programs – Lou, KG8NK requested ideas for programs be submitted to us.

<u>Field Day/Picnic</u> – Lou, KG8NK, suggested a committee be set up for this event and suggested it be discussed at the next meeting.

<u>MARS</u> – Lou, KG8NK, reported MARS is trying to get more members involved in the organization. MARS works with Homeland Security, the Transportation Safety Administration, and many other governmental organizations. The nets are in the a.m. and p.m., 3 hours of net time is needed every 90 days, and digital modes are used.

<u>Spotter Training and First Aid</u> – Greg, KI8AF, reported spotter training by the National Weather Service will be May 7, 2009. A discussion followed concerning the possibility of offering a basic first aid class consisting of about 1 to 2 evenings.

Live Streaming Audio of 27 Repeater

Right after the 2009 U.P. 200 and Midnight Run sled dog races were completed Paul KB0P and Mike KE8IL were contacted about trying to put our 2-meter communications onto the U.P. 200 web page so everyone interested in the event would be able to hear actual live coverage. It hasn't taken Paul very long to figure that one out. He is now testing live steaming audio on his webpage. The audio is from our 27 repeater and the linked repeater system as well as other local repeaters. He is using a scanner in scan mode to input the steaming audio. Initial test have proven very positive. Go to Paul's site, follow the directions listed and give it a try. There is a 10 to 15 second time delay so don't give up to easily and remember the repeater has to be in use for the steaming audio to be heard. His site is www.kb0p.com

Burghardt to No Longer Sell Amateur Radio Equipment

On March 16, Jim Smith, W0MJY, owner of Burghardt Amateur Center in Watertown, South Dakota, announced that the company will no longer sell Amateur Radio transceivers and accessories. The company, now called Burghardt Radio Repair, has canceled all backorders. In an e-mail, Smith blamed the current economic conditions for the change that forced the company "to re-evaluate our goals and direction. We will continue to provide radio repair service as it has become a very busy business. Our technicians are very experienced and parts inventories are good. Thank you for your support in the past and we look forward to continuing our relationships through our servicing facility." Jim Smith's son, Mike Smith, KC0FTM, told the ARRL that even though the company has had to lay off employees in the past couple of months, "Burghardt will concentrate on service, just like we have been doing since 1973." Burghardt was founded in 1937 by Stan Burghardt, W0IT (SK), as Burghardt Radio Supply. He sold the company to Smith in 1982, remaining active in the company until January 2002. Burghardt passed away in 2004 at the age of 93.













S.K. Enterprise Shuttle Preparing for 2009 Launch

S.K. Enterprise is schedule to launch on the following dates: May 19, 20, 21, 22, 26, 27, 28, 29 and June 1.
