WHAT'S NEXT FOR US

Using Our Linked Repeater System

While the program scheduled for our April meeting is about repeater design, installation, setup and operations here is a quick reminder about using our linked repeater system and any repeater system.

When using our linked repeater system the first and foremost thing to remember is the short time delay between the repeaters connecting and disconnecting from transmit and receive mode and the reverse.

So, if it's your turn to transmit wait a second or two once the previous person has finished transmitting (letting the repeaters on the system dropout and reset the time out features) and then you can key up with your PPT button but again wait a second or two (so all the repeaters can make reconnection) prior to you transmitting.

Next time you miss the first few words of someone's transmission, remind that individual they should wait that second or two before they actually transmit and it will be a good reminder for you as well.



What does this do? Split-Frequency Operating

Usually you can communicate with others stations using a single frequency for receiving and transmitting. However, there are cases where you may need to select one frequency for transmitting and one for receiving. This is Split-Frequency Operation. This will require the use of two VFOs, which most of not all modern transceivers have. The most common use of HF "split-frequency operation" is when a highly desired DX station is on the air. And currently many of the W1AW portable stations are on the air with so many individuals trying to make contact with them. The most important part of "split-frequency operation" lies in the hands of the receiving (non-DX) stations, that is listen to the DX station's instructions. A good DX operator will continually advise you of his wishes on the frequency(s) he is listening to. Normally on phone operations they may say "listening 5 up" or "5 to 10 up", which means 5 kHz or 5 - 10 kHz. On CW they will usually send "UP 1" or maybe "UP 1-2" or sometimes just "UP". This would mean 1 kHz or between 1 and 2 kHz. "UP" is a bit more challenging as this usually means they are listening over a much larger frequency range. Please check your transceiver's manual for the proper procedures. This information may be old hat and repetitive for some of you but for those new to ham radio or just getting started with HF operations I hope this helps you out.



Hint: If you hear the station you wish to contact but don't hear anyone attempting to contact them on this frequency you can be pretty sure that this station is listening on a different frequency(s). Listen up a bit on the band and if you hear a mess of stations transmitting you are in luck. Or Not!

PS: Don't get frustrated and remember that patience is a virtue.

CTCSS......Continuous tone coded squelch system. A sub-audible tone system used on some repeaters. When added to a carrier, a CTCSS tone allows a receiver to accept a signal. Also called PL.

Programs – Ideas for July and August? Contact Bruce Carlson N9MDE.


PR help – Lane WD8PAJ needs some help with the PR. It's important to get our club information out and it doesn't take a lot of time.
