FROM THE PRESIDENT



At the April monthly meeting we had some good discussions and made a few of significant decisions.

1. We approved a policy whereby a member in good standing could ask the membership to borrow one of the HF mobile radio sets to learn about HF radios before purchasing their own equipment.

2. We approved a "silent bidding" initiative to sell 2 HARA Yaesu handheld radios. The radios have been in HARA possession for a long time and are seldom if ever used. The thought process was to get them in the hands of those who want to use them. They are similar to the Baofeng, but much better quality and more bands. You should have received an email from Greg, KI8AF, on the process for the silent bidding. The winners will be announced at the May meeting.

3. We had a lengthy discussion about changing the format/content of our monthly meetings. Pretty much all in attendance agreed that we should get away from the meetings being mostly "business meetings" and more into projects and programs. While there isn't any formal paperwork to make this happen, it WILL require members to volunteer to present programs of general and/or specific ham radio topics. I, as the current president, have committed to hold the "business" portion of the meeting to 20 minutes or less. Then we will dedicate the rest of the time to "tech talk."

4. Scott, WU8H, also made a good short presentation about the Discord app. See Scott to get signed up. It is a private HARA discussion group with many topics.

The regular monthly meeting of the Hiawatha Amateur Radio Association was held on Thursday April 3, 2025 at 7:00 pm at the Marquette County Health Department, the President being in the chair and the Secretary being present.

The meeting minutes of the February meeting, as provided by the Secretary, were approved.

In attendance were Tom, KE8TPT - President, Brad, KE8TPS - Vice President, Mike, KD8JIR - Treasurer, Scott, WU8H - Secretary, 8 additional members and 2 guests. A quorum was met.

ARES/RACES:

No report this month as Jim, N8NAV is traveling.

Repeater Committee:

Tom KE8TPT noted the following status changes to the repeaters:

146.64/Gwinn:

- John, N8JI has suggested a test to isolate the 120V power supply to see if that is what is generating the noise. On hold waiting for warmer weather.
- New backup 147.27 headend, UHF repeater returned to Yaesu for warrant repairs. After it is returned it is ready to bring to the tower shack and set it up for testing.

Old Business:

• A motion was made to accept Policy and Procedures for the Loan of Hiawatha Amateur Radio Association (HARA) Radio Equipment. Motion passed.

New Business:

- A motion was made to put the clubs two Yaesu VX-5R HTs up for auction under closed bidding. Bidding to start at \$50 with \$.50 increments. Bidding to close May 1, 2025, 1300 local (1700 UTC). Motion passed.
- A motion was made to reimburse Tom KE8TPT \$308.76 for the following expenses related to the backup 147.27 repeater:
 - UHF 6 Cavity Duplexer.
 - Real-time clock board for RC210 repeater controller.
 - Freight to ship DR-2X back to Yaesu for warranty repair. Motion passed.

I will continue to occupy this space until the next ARES Emergency Coordinator takes over.

You just never know when Ham Radio will come in handy. The appropriateness of that statement came vividly true on March 5, 2025. Our very own Bill, KC8EWD who is a resident at the Jacobetti Veterans Home needed immediate assistance. Apparently his nurse call button was malfunctioning. Being the resourceful Ham, Bill grabbed his 2-meter handheld and put out a call on the K8LOD repeater. As is her norm, Lucille, KD8PTE was monitoring the repeater. Bill provided the appropriate phone number for the facility and Lucille put in a call to the nurse's station. Staff shortly arrived and Bill received the attention that he needed. Well Done to both Bill and Lucille for their quick thinking and action!

My shack is in our basement – what I affectionately refer to as the "bomb shelter". Accordingly, I don't have my 2-meter rig on very often. When I am in the shack, I usually have the HF rig on and I find that my attention span is insufficient to monitor more than one radio. We have an excellent local repeater system. HARA's Silent Bid on Yaesu VX-5R HTs

HARA has two Yaesu VX-5R (2m/440/50mhz) handheld radios that are up for your silent bid entry if you are interested. The price of each was close to \$300 when new:

1.Both of these HTs were maybe used once or twice and are in excellent condition.

2.Each has been checked out and is in working order.

3. The battery for each will need to be replaced (one battery works but is in weak condition).

4. Charger and manual included for each.

5.Each is programmed with many of the U.P. repeater frequencies but some editing may be necessary if CTCSS tones have been changed.

The starting bid for each is \$50.00 with bid increments of 50 cents.

The "silent bid" process will continue until May 1, 2025, 1300 local (1700 utc).

The winner(s) will be notified via email and arrange to pick up and pay for the radio at the club meeting the evening of May 1st or make arrangements to obtain it from the appropriate club board member. There will be NO mailing of the items.

4. The below information has run for a couple of months now. I am going to include it one more time in the hopes that someone will step forward and assume the Marquette County EC position.

The ARRL Emergency Coordinator (EC) is appointed by the Section Manager (or at the SM's discretion, the SEC may make the appointment).

The ARRL Emergency Coordinator is the person responsible for the ARES group at the local level. Working with local community officials, the Section Emergency Coordinator (SEC), and other field appointees, the EC leads his or her local ARES group through the planning, preparedness, and response phases.

Requirements

Technician-class license or higher; full ARRL membership, and achievement of Level 3 qualifications. (Must, within the period of 1 year, from the issuance of this document or appointment as EC, whichever comes later, or such further time period as authorized by the SM, complete all of the requirements for Level 3 qualification.)

Responsibilities

•Promote and enhance the activities of the Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) for the benefit of the public as a voluntary, non-commercial communications service.

•Manage and coordinate the training, organization, and emergency participation of interested amateurs working in support of the communities, agencies, or functions designated by the Section Emergency Coordinator (SEC)/Section Manager (SM).

•Establish viable working partnerships with federal, state, county, city governmental and/or private agencies in the ARES jurisdictional area that needs the services of ARES in emergencies.

•Identify and work collaboratively with local partners to assess how ARES can assist them with their mission, ensuring partners are aware of the limitations and capabilities of ARES.

•Develop detailed local operational plans, with partner agency officials in the jurisdiction that set forth precisely what expectations are during an ARES activation. Work jointly with partners to establish relationships based on mutual trust and respect. All matters involving recruitment and utilization of ARES participants are directed by the EC, in response to the needs assessed by the agency officials. Technical issues involving message format, security of message transmission, disaster welfare inquiry policies, and others, should be reviewed and expounded upon in the ARES detailed local operations plans.

•Establish local communications networks that run on a regular basis, and periodically test those networks by conducting realistic drills.

•Work with the SEC and District Emergency Coordinators (DECs) to identify potential local shortcomings and define resources that may need to be drawn from adjacent ARES groups in support of a local emergency or disaster.

•Establish an emergency traffic plan, with welfare traffic inclusive, utilizing the National Traffic System (NTS) as one active component for traffic handling. Establish an operational liaison with local and section nets, particularly for handling welfare traffic in an emergency situation.

•Work with other Amateur Radio public service groups, organizations or programs to establish relationships of mutual trust and respect, and a coordination mechanism for the good of the public and Amateur Radio. The goal is to foster an efficient and effective Amateur Radio response overall.

•Work for growth in the local ARES program, making it a stronger, more valuable resource and hence able to meet more of the agencies' local needs.

• Collect and consolidate your activities and activities of your ARES members each month, and submit monthly progress summaries to the Section Emergency Coordinator. Provide timely reporting of emergency and public safety communications rendered in the Section for potential inclusion in ARRL media relations activities.

Recruitment of new hams and ARRL members is an integral part of the job of every ARRL appointee. Appointees should take advantage of every opportunity to recruit a new ham or member to foster growth of Field Organization programs, and our abilities to serve the public.
