

Look Who's Talking

Okay, I borrowed this title from a popular 1989 movie of the same name starring John Travolta and Kirstie Alley, but it fits nicely into today's topic. I have written

previously regarding Ham Radio operating events. Today, I would like to take that topic a bit further. I classify operating events into 3 categories:

- 1. Short duration events that celebrate a specific theme. My prior article on Skywarn Recognition Day would fit this category.
- 2. Events that last a few days, or weeks. A DX-pedition to an exotic locale would be an example.
- 3. An event of long duration spanning several weeks or months.

It is this third category that I would like to address. Recently, we have had two of these long-term operating events: 1) The 2015 centennial of the founding of the American Radio Relay League (ARRL) and 2) the just-concluded 2016 100-year anniversary of our National Park Service. This last operating event itself was fittingly called National Parks on the Air (NPOTA). If you missed either of these, you missed a fun time.

So why am I telling you about events that are no longer active? The answer is to encourage you NOT to miss anymore! As I've mentioned previously, the beauty of Ham Radio is that you can put as much, or as little, effort into operating as fits your interest and lifestyle. Obviously, we (the collective WE) would like all Hams to participate in all events.

With work and/or family obligations, that is usually not possible. What is possible is taking a few minutes, or hours, to participate in some events. And how does one learn which operating events are occurring at what times? I'm glad you asked!

If you are an ARRL member, you should receive – either electronically or hard copy – your monthly copy of QST. There is a page, entitled Contest Corral, that lists upcoming operating events for the month and the websites that contain their instructions. You can also subscribe to a weekly email – usually delivered to your electronic mailbox on Thursday or Friday – that contains a condensed version for the upcoming week. Another popular Ham periodical is CQ. The folks at CQ sponsor their own series of operating events during the year. For more information on both of these fine organizations, please see their websites:

And one final plug for a local operating event, some HARA members gather on 10-meter SSB (28.400) on Friday nights at 7:00 pm local time. We are a friendly and informal bunch that discusses just about any topic. Whichever form it takes, I hope to hear you on the airwaves!
