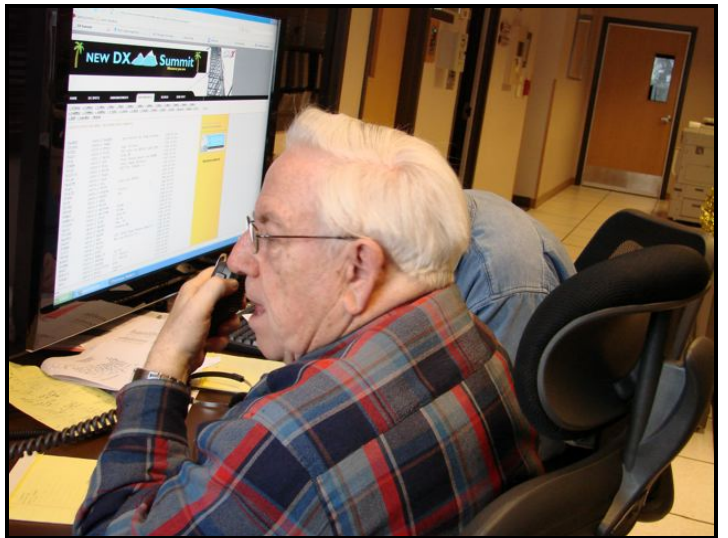
PR.....Happenings

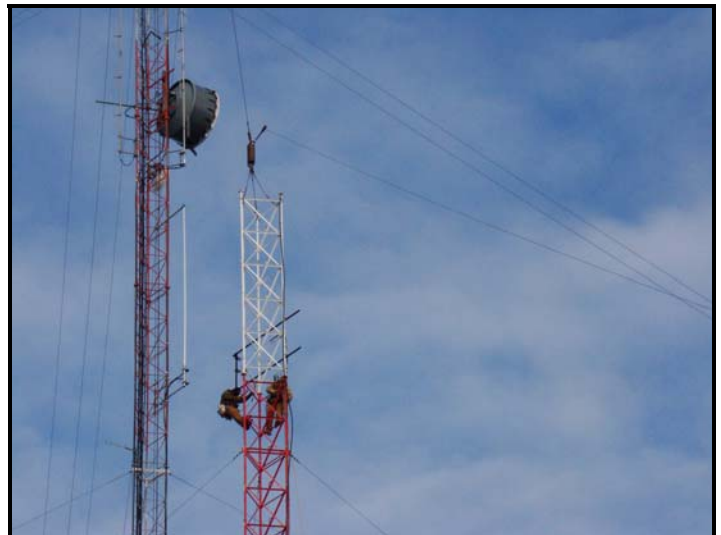

My Early Forays into Radio

My twin brother Warren (W9VKG), and I were born in 1936 and we had an early interest in radio. When we were about 8 years old we had read about radio in my mother's encyclopedia an already obsolete 1920's edition. This encyclopedia described how spark transmitters were used previously for communications. Warren and I having poked round in my grandfather's garage found an old model T ford spark coil. We found that if we hooked it up to a six volt battery that it would product a spark across about 1/2 to 3/4 inch gap.

We lived on the outskirts of a very small (Pop 800) farming village in Wisconsin, called Glenwood "City", which reminds me of our 'International' Airport at KI Sawyer. Grandfather had one cow to keep our family supplied with milk along with a chicken coop (no longer populated). This coop became our illegal sham shack with its own distinct odor. My brother and I managed to climb up on the roof to put up herten antenna about 20 ft long.

After building a key we filled the ether with a band covering the whole frequency spectrum. At least the broadcast band and I am sure the few neighbors that were with in a mile heard also. We heard it at our house which was a couple of hundred yards away from my grandpa's place. I only reveal all this since I think the statue of limitations has ran out.

I have more about our early experiences I if haven't been a completely boor.
