You MUST preregister at least by the Tuesday evening preceding the Saturday test date. Contact Rich N8GBA at 249-3837, n8gba@att.net or Greg KI8AF at ki8af@arrl.net.

Please arrive one-half hour early for test sessions to give time to process applications. Testing applicants should bring the following items with them: Two pieces of I.D. one being a photo I.D., Original license and one clear copy of their license if applicable. Completed form 605 (one will be provided if you don't have one), pencils, calculator and the test fee of \$15.00. Please have the correct fee as examiners do not carry change. You must have an FRN and **provide a valid email address**. Please contact the individual(s) *listed to confirm date(s), location(s), etc.*

News

from the desk of N8NAV

On Saturday, June 26th, members of the Hiawatha Amateur Radio Association (HARA) participated in Field Day. Field Day is an annual two-day operating event sponsored by the ARRL. Their website, www.arrl.org, as well as others will provide you with comprehensive information. As the local ARES Emergency Coordinator, I would like to focus on one of the goals – sustained Amateur Radio operations in the field. These operations are often without the benefit of commercial a/c electrical power, using both factory and home built transceivers ranging in power from less than 5 to 100 watts, and utilizing antennas that can be rapidly deployed. These are the sort of scenarios that we Hams can expect to experience in an emergency!

Another important goal is the ability to demonstrate Amateur Radio to both new (and old) operators as well as the general public. So Field Day sites are normally set up in locales that encourage visitation, exploration and meaningful discussion. This year, HARA held our Field Day operations at the West Branch Township Hall – and we are grateful for their continuing support!

Saturday's operation consisted of four stations. One was dedicated to digital (FT8) and CW, another was dedicated to SSB operations, a third switched between SSB and CW and the fourth was a QRP SSB rig. Murphy visited the site early and concentrated on the FT8 station. Try as we might, we just couldn't get the rig and/or the laptop to cooperate. As is common with these types of operations, the group suffered with bouts of front-end overload due to the close proximity of radios and antennas.

Field Day is an event and NOT a contest. While points are awarded, the focus is on the opportunity for Hams to get together, the ability to demonstrate different facets of our great hobby to each other and the public and – probably most importantly – have a good time. I believe that a good time was had by all! If you don't believe me, take a look at the photos on the next pages.

Our sincere thanks to all those who made the HARA 2021 Field Day event a memorable one!
