June 18, 2022

Marquette: 8:30am eastern time, (arrive by 8:00am) Marquette County Health Dept. Bldg., U.S. 41 just east of the Michigan State Police Post. You MUST preregister at least by the Tuesday evening preceding the Saturday test date. Contact Rich N8GBA at 249-3837, n8gba@att.net or Greg KI8AF at ki8af@arrl.net.

Please arrive one-half hour early for test sessions to give time to process applications. Testing applicants should bring the following items with them: Two pieces of I.D. one being a photo I.D., Original license and one clear copy of their license if applicable, Completed form 605 (one will be provided if you don't have one), pencils, calculator and the test fee of \$15.00. Please have the correct fee as examiners do not carry change. **You must have an FRN and provide a valid email address**. *Please contact the individual(s) listed to confirm date(s), location(s), etc.*

Attending: President - Lou KG8NK; VP - Greg KI8AF; Treasurer - Mike KD8JIR; Secretary - Scott WU8H, 8 additional members and 3 guests.

President Lou KG8NK opened the meeting at 1900 with an update on his recent surgery and recovery, followed by introductions.

Agenda: Scott WU8H added an item to the new business section of the agenda.

Secretary's Report: Some corrections and clarifications to last month's minutes were offered by Greg KI8AF:

- 1. Mike, KD8JIR, is coordinating Field Day. Field Day will be held at the West Branch Township Hall on Saturday, June 25, 2022.
- 2. As far as the \$35 license fees, the FCC will coordinate by email for the collection of these fees.

Committee Reports:

Repeaters:

• The local repeaters are working well, but we still are experiencing some problems with the .82 system. Greg KI8AF reported that Paul, KB0P, may be bringing a new cable to the Green Bay Hamfest. Once the cable has been acquired and installed it will hopefully fix the issue.

ARES/RACES:

- Brian Hummel, the new Marquette Co. Emergency Manager, was introduced and made some comments regarding impending changes to the county communications structured, including a move of the EOC.
- Jim, N8NAV, reported that the exercise on Winlink on April 30 went very well with 22 check-ins (11 Winlink, 11 voice). This was a very good representation for the county and we received kudos for our participation. (see Jim's report later in this edition Ed.)
- There are currently two ARES-affiliated radio stations one is in the basement of the State Police Post, which is currently under construction, and the other is at the National Weather Service which is currently closed to the public. With the impending move of the county EOC, there was discussion about collecting our equipment at the Post and relocating it to storage until the new EOC is accessible.
- There was a short discussion about revitalizing CERT (Community Emergency Response Team).

from the desk of N8NAV



The Marquette Co. ARES group participated in a statewide Auxiliary Communications (AuxComm) drill on April 30, 2022. The goal was the introduction and use of the Winlink digital communications protocol to provide emergency communications from the individual counties to the State EOC in Lansing. The exercise scenario was a series of rolling brown/blackouts across the state. We had 22 stations check-in during our portion of the exercise period – 11 by voice on the K8LOD 147.27 MHz linked repeater system and 11 using Winlink. A graphic recap of how we faired with the scoring for the exercise is presented below:

As for the scoring, the Upper Peninsula as a whole came out on top. The scores for the districts are:

2. ARRL International Digital Contest

Contest Objective: Amateurs worldwide contact and exchange QSO information with other amateurs using any digital mode (excluding RTTY) that supports the 4-digit Grid Square exchange — attended operation only -- on the 160, 80, 40, 20, 15, 10 and 6 meter bands (Technicians are limited per FCC Rules to the 10 and 6 meter bands). Any station may work any other station. Stations may only be worked once per band, regardless of mode. Automated operation is not permitted -- each claimed contact must include contemporaneous direct initiation by the operator on both sides of the contact.

Dates: First full weekend of June (June 4-5, 2022).

Contest Period: Begins 1800 UTC Saturday, ends 2359 UTC Sunday.

This is a new contest. I, of course, was thinking FT8. I checked the rules at the above website and saw no specific mention of FT8, but it IS a digital mode that supports grid square exchange and it is NOT RTTY – Ed.

Once or twice a year, there are operating events that feature these impressive stations. The next event is June 4-5, 2022.
