Marquette: 8:30am eastern time, (arrive by 8:00am) Marquette County Health Dept. Bldg., U.S. 41 just east of the Michigan State Police Post. You MUST preregister at least by the Tuesday evening preceding the Saturday test date. Contact Rich N8GBA at 249-3837, n8gba@att.net or Greg KI8AF at ki8af@arrl.net.

Please arrive one-half hour early for test sessions to give time to process applications. Testing applicants should bring the following items with them: Two pieces of I.D. one being a photo I.D., Original license and one clear copy of their license if applicable, Completed form 605 (one will be provided if you don't have one), pencils, calculator and the test fee of \$15.00. Please have the correct fee as examiners do not carry change. You must have an FRN and **provide a valid email address**. *Please contact the individual(s) listed to confirm date(s), location(s), etc.*

Huntsville (AL) Hamfest

After two years of no Dayton Hamvention, I was so desperate for a Hamfest that I drove almost 1,000 miles south to Huntsville, Alabama!

Actually, my wife and I took the opportunity to stage a mini-vacation to celebrate our 30th wedding anniversary. But that detracts from the story.

As you can see from the photos, their entrance sign reads, "The World's Friendliest Hamfest". Having never been to a Hamfest outside of the U.S., I cannot personally confirm that statement. I will say that the people of Huntsville – both in the city and at the Hamfest – are a friendly bunch!

The venue is held at the Von Braun Convention Center. If you know anything about the U.S. rocket and space program, the name Dr. Werner Von Braun should ring a memory bell. In fact, Huntsville is also known as Rocket City and is home to the U.S. Space and Rocket Center.

The Hamfest is held on the third weekend in August and is totally indoors, which makes it very nice and dry on wet days like on the Saturday I attended. It also makes it extremely difficult for "gate crashing" (note for Bob & Pete). If you have attended our HARA Swap & Shop or the recent UP Hamfest, Huntsville is definitely larger. If you have attended the Dayton Hamvention, Huntsville is a bit smaller. According to their website (www.hamfest.org), this year's attendance was 4,069, down from 5,088 in 2019.

As I pen this article on 9/7/21, I heard on TV6 weather that some areas of the UP experienced nickel-size hail and strong wind gusts. And you don't need to have lived long in the area to have experienced severe winter weather!
