Words from the President Tom, W8JWN

Some odds and ends from the past month:

The ARRL RTTY Roundup has come and gone. It is my favorite contest. I finally won a plaque for the Great Lakes Division High Power Single Operator category in 2010. This year, thanks again to my SO2R (Single Operator 2 Radio) setup and the 4-element SteppIR bi-directional mode, I beat my score from last year by 8,000 points. Conditions were not great, no 10 meters at all, but it was still a lot of fun.

Murphy made a visit a few days before the start of the contest. I lost two of my three amps. I finally got the Heathkit SB-220

back on the air, after filing some bumps off of the tuning capacitor. A very high SWR on 15 meters, over 5:1, caused arcing. The Butternut vertical needs work on 15. It's a good thing that I finally got the second radio beam up on the tower two days before the contest started. The SWR was 1:1 on the A3S.

The Dentron MLA-2500 could not be fixed. Fuse kept blowing. (Possibly, a power supply issue?) Gary, our May-November amp expert, will be asked to check it out this coming summer. I just have the Alpha 99 and the SB-220 for the remaining contests. Hopefully, no more Mr. Murphy visits to this QTH! Hint: check your SWR before loading up!!!

What I learned about transferring programs from one computer to another computer with a different operating system in a few words. Don't do it! My Vista logging and contest programs failed to work, when I went back to XP. This caused some hair pulling before the contest. Finally, I downloaded all of the programs, on the XP computer and started over. Many hours were spent setting up the programs. I have learned a lesson!

In the January issue of *QST*, the article entitled, "The last CQ-A Survivor's Guide", goes into detail concerning organizing our "ham radio estate" if we are called to that "great ham shack" in the sky. Amateur Radio in the Classroom: ARRL Teachers Institute Now Accepting Applications for 2011 Sessions

The ARRL Education Services Department has announced the 2011 schedule for the Teachers Institute on Wireless Technology (TI) workshop. Offered through the ARRL's Education & Technology Program, the Teachers Institute is a four-day, expenses paid, inresidence learning opportunity designed for motivated teachers and other school staff who want to learn more about wireless technology and bring that knowledge to their students.

A variety of topics are covered during the TI, including basic wireless technology literacy, electronics, the science of radio, radio astronomy, how to bring space into the classroom, ham radio operation, introduction to micro controllers and basic robotics. While participants do not need to have an Amateur Radio license to attend the basic TI sessions, one is required for the advanced (TI-2) session.

All information about the Teachers Institutes – including the application and a downloadable brochure is available online. There you will also find links on that page where hams and interested instructors can reed more about what other ETP schools are doing with Amateur Radio and wireless technology topics.

The range of the 2 meter repeater is about 40 miles under normal conditions, depending upon terrain. The 440 MHz repeater has a range of about 25 miles.


should bring the following items with them: Two pieces of I.D. one being a photo I.D., Original license and

Will 10 meter DX Return?

A 2009 prediction, published in a report at www.spaceweather.com, states: "The panel predicts the upcoming Solar Cycle 24 will peak in May 2013 with a daily sunspot number of 90. If the prediction proves true, Solar Cycle 24 will be the weakest cycle since number 16, which peaked at 78 daily sunspots in 1928, and ninth weakest since the 1750s, when numbered cycles began."



Looks like the low bands will continue to be best for DX. It's time to work on those 40 and 80 meter verticals, 4-Squares, if you have the room, and, if you have the cash and the tower, 2-3 element beams for 40. If you think about it, 2020 isn't that far away!
