Words from the President

In this issue, you will find the new proposals for a change in our club constitution. Please study them and be prepared to vote on them as written, or add suggestions at the May 10th meeting.

Field Day

We are in need of the following for Field Day on June 25-26 at Marion Park in Norway: one laptop computer for Station #2. A second computer for the GOTA station would be nice but not necessary. Transceivers are needed for Station #2 and the GOTA (Get On the Air) station. I will have my Icom 706 MKII G for Station #1.

The N3FJP Field Day logging program will be demonstrated at the June 14th meeting. All FD operators should attend this meeting. Speaking of operators, hopefully we will have several on that weekend. Remember, newly licensed Technicians can operate the GOTA station to give the club bonus points. You can also operate one of the main stations, if a control operator is present. I will be the control operator for the GOTA station. W8JWN will be the GOTA call.

Revised amendments to the club Constitution based on input at the April 12th meeting.

ARTICLE VII of the Constitution

Amendments:

Section 1---This Constitution or the Bylaws may be amended by a favorable vote from a majority of the total membership. Proposals for amendments shall be submitted in writing at the regular meeting and may not be voted on until the next regular meeting, provided all members have been notified by mail of the intent to amend the constitution and/or Bylaws at a specific meeting.

Proposal #1

Proposed Section 6 under

REMOVAL OF MEMBERS

(1)- Any member whose Federal Communications Commission-issued Amateur Radio license is suspended or revoked with cause by the FCC shall be automatically removed from membership in the Mich-A-Con ARC.

(2) - Any member who operates his/her station in violation of Part 97 of the FCC Rules and Regulations, and who does not cease and desist from the aforementioned violations, may be removed from membership in the Mich-A-Con ARC.

(3) - Any member who causes adverse publicity to Amateur Radio or the Mich-A-Con ARC may be removed from membership in the Mich-A-Con ARC.

(4)- Whenever a charge is made against a member that could result in his or her expulsion from membership, the Board of Directors shall investigate such charge. If the Board determines to proceed with the matter, the member involved shall be notified and given the opportunity to appear before the Board or, at the member's election, to respond in writing and answer or defend against such charge. After the member has been given reasonable opportunity to appear and defend, the Board of Directors shall act upon the charge and by a majority vote of all members of the Board either reject the charge, continue membership

upon stated conditions, or expel. A **member** charged with conduct unbecoming a **member** of this **Club** may be expelled by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present at a meeting of the membership, if the **Board of Directors** has found the charges are sustained by its investigations.

(5)-The expelled member may apply, in person before the Board of Directors, for membership in the club one year after expulsion.

Proposal #2

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The **Board of Directors, consisting of the President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer**, shall be the governing body of the **Club** and as such shall formulate and be responsible for all matters of policy. It shall review all reports of conduct unbecoming a **member** of the **Club** and, if sustained, submit the matter to the body of the **Club** at a regular meeting.

Please attend the May 10th Meeting to vote on the proposed changes to the club's constitution !

FYI, I built two of these PVC, air powered antenna launchers:

<http://www.antennalaunchers.com/csv19/index.html> I'll have one of them at field day.

The trickiest part of building this is drilling the holes in the ends of the two end caps. The instructions recommend using a lathe but I don't have access to one but I do have a shop full of woodworking tools so I built me a jig. I use the jig with my hand held router with a pattern following bit to cut the holes and it works great. Most of the antenna launcher building time is cutting, sanding and gluing PVC. The instructions are very detailed and should be studied before beginning assembly. Sanding both of the mating PVC surfaces before gluing is important for strength.

The thing works great as detailed on the [eham.net](http://www.eham.net) reviews (link from above). I'd be happy to loan my jig to any ham (it's not a kids toy) that wants to build one of these.



Mich-A-Con Amateur Radio Club Minutes of the April 12th, 2011 Meeting

President Tom Martin called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Secretary Report

The minutes of the March 8th meeting were read and approved.

Treasurer Report

Membership Dues Received: \$70.00

Checks were written to: March 28th to AT&T for \$23.54

Balances as of April 12th, 2011:

Checking - \$ 96.80

Regular Savings - \$1,193.56 of which \$361.82 is in the Trailer Fund.

Repeater Savings - \$1,126.50

Petty Cash - \$15.00, President Tom made a \$1.00 donation for a balance of \$16.00

We now have 35 paid members for 2011.

Repeater Report

No problems to report. Nate Mieras reported that he made and tested a linking cable. The cable needs more testing.

ARES

The net has been meeting regularly.

Old Business

Paul Schultz reported that the storage box has been de-identified and placed on the ground behind his business, Schultz Equipment in Iron Mountain. The box is on the southwest corner of the property adjacent to Terminal Ave. It was agreed to leave the box there as opposed to a more secure location such as Ford Airport.

Paul will organize the trailer committee and other volunteers to build storage shelves inside the box at no cost to the club. Dimensions of the shelves were discussed briefly. The committee will decide on the shelf dimensions during construction but will basically be 2' deep on each side of a 3 ½' isle with room underneath for the generator and tower sections. Burt Armbrust Sr will purchase a master lock and the contents of the trailer will be moved to the box and the trailer will be put up for sale at a price no lower than \$1,500.00 Trailer title was given to Paul for safe keeping.

President Tom discussed an amendment to the club's constitution at length with input from most members in attendance. Proposed Section 6 under removal of members were three descriptions of violations that could result in a member's removal from the club. The "assessed a fine and penalty" by the FCC under provision one will be removed. The members agreed that a sealed vote should take place at a regular club meeting to decide if a member should be removed or not as opposed to the executive committee making a decision.

Majority of yes or no votes will determine if the member will be removed or not. Abstain votes will not be counted. Example: With 12 members attending a regular club meeting, 5 vote yes and 4 vote no and 3 abstain. Yes votes win and member is removed. A tie vote would result in non- removal of the member. A fourth provision will be added stating that a removed member can reapply for club membership to the board after one year. The revised amendment will be presented at the May meeting and voted on at the June meeting.

Paul Schultz will make inquiries to get a 35-40' lift for the beam antenna for field day and report at the May meeting.

New Business

President Tom detailed callingpost.com website which the club has been a member of for several years. The system allows subscriber to record a message and then schedule that message to dial out and played to all phone numbers specified. It's a time saving method to get a consistent message out by phone to all club members. Some members provided new or revised home and cell phone numbers that Tom will update. The executive committee and the ARES coordinator Dennis, K8SWX will be given access.

James McLaughlin, WA2EWE/T6AF killed in Afganistan:

James McLaughlin, WA2EWE/T6AF, was one of several killed in Kabul, Afghanistan on Wednesday, April 27. News sources say that eight American troops and a US contractor died Wednesday after an Afghan military pilot opened fire during a meeting in an operations room of the Afghan Air Corps at the Kabul airport -- the deadliest episode to date of an Afghan turning against his coalition partners, officials with the NATO-led International Security Assistance Force (ISF) in Afghanistan said.

Licensed since 1972, McLaughlin was a career US military officer. Bob Magnani, K6QXY, told the ARRL that McLaughlin was just in the US a week ago, visiting his family: "His son Adam, KD6POE, works for me. He told me that his dad had been in Afghanistan and Iraq many times over the past few years, most currently serving as a flight instructor."

McLaughlin posted on his qrz.com page that "almost every day, I operate at around 1230 - 1430 UTC. Sometimes I am QRV until around 1500 UTC." As of March 26, 2011, he had logged 4359 QSOs, most of them on RTTY and PSK. -- Thanks to Russ Bentson, K6KLY, CNN and Fox News for the information

Tom added:

"I worked Jim on 20 meter RTTY on Feb. 17, 2011. He was my first Afghanistan station on RTTY."

If your group would like to be a part of the Station Locator Service, it's easy to get started -- just go to the Field Day Station Locator website and follow the instructions. ARRL Field Day is the most popular on-the-air operating event in Amateur Radio. On June 25-26, join tens of thousands of Amateur Radio operators as they gather for a public demonstration of the Amateur Radio Service.
