STORM SPOTTING

The last few weeks of spring here in Dickinson County have been teasing us with strong storms approaching, only to break up at the last minute. Just a few days ago we had a line of storms approaching our area and then.... they mellowed out into a nice soaking rain.

Storm Spotting is a love - hate relationship. I find myself getting all fired up as the weather watches come out and the storms intensify. The 2 meter radio comes alive as hams across several counties and two states begin assessing the weather. Some of us ride through the streets. Others keep a watchful eye on the radar from a home base. A few operators can simply walk outside and get a fantastic view of what mother nature is unleashing. I here reports of all kinds being called in to both Marquette Weather and Green Bay Weather. I try to get a fix on where the storms are and how they are moving so I can stay out of the path of danger but still make useful observations. As I ride down the streets of Iron Mountain, Kingsford and the surrounding area I hope my efforts will make a difference.

The storms do dissipated so I head for home and rag chew with Dennis, K8SWX about what thankfully missed us. Reports of power outages and trees down south of us along with dangerous lightening and hail continue to be reported as I pull into the driveway at home. Dennis notes he got into ARES because of the tornado we had a few years ago in Dickinson county. The storm came up so fast that most people had little or no warning. Our area was lucky that no one was hurt during the event.

I have to admit I have always enjoyed watching big storms. Dennis and the other ARES members out spotting are a special breed, we watch and listen, follow and report all for the simple 73's we give each other when the night is over. Dennis has it right, he notes we do not want a damaging storm but we want to make sure that if we get one our reports will help the Weather Service warn the public about the approaching danger. A Storm Spotter report can save lives!

One of the first things I learned when studying to become a Ham is that a good operator spends more time listening than talking. Storm Spotting has a similar trait, we spend much of our time observing the usual in hopes of being prepared for the unusual!

The summer is just beginning and with the active patterns we have seen so far this year we may be out Storm Spotting a lot more. Mother Nature likes to keep us busy!
