
You're Fired!

Our noontime restaurant was full of the small, delicate cups and dishes made by this factory, so we enquired about where they were made. Just down the road, was the reply. The factory has a history over a century old and many of the original kilns and molds are on display. We bought what we thought we could safely wrap in socks and sweatshirts.
