Steve, KD2BS, joins us on ZOOM tonight from Hilton Head. He has been using RHR for any of his recent DX activities.

Pat, KE2LJ, reported that his local radio club is working on sprucing up his TH3 antenna which he donated to the club.

Tom, KA2D, reported that he has been under the weather recently. He is not active currently with radio, although he helps out at GSBARC.

Rick, K2RB, has been very active on the bands. His station is now completely FLEX. He acquired a StepIR DB18 antenna. This antenna has greatly improved his signal.
