HF CONDITIONS

During the last month, from January 9th to February
14th, the Solar Flux Index varied 19 points. The high was
92 on January 9th and the low is 73 on February 14th.
Thus there was less variation with the high tenpoints lower
and the low two points higher in value than last month.
During the last month there was one broad, low peak of
nearly a week in late January and early February that
reached 90. It was associated with two small but persistent
Sunspots moving across the Earth-facing side of the Sun.
Currently, February 14th, the Solar Flux is at 73. It has not
been quite this low since the end of December.

W9LYN saw only moderate activity this past month. The two element 20 meter delta loop beam is still only partially repaired for use on the low end of the band. Hence, it is the 17 meter vertical dipole and the 160 meter inverted "L" with the tuner at its base that have been used as antennas.

Some time was spent in the CQ WW 160 meter CW contest the last night of the last full weekend in January and 51 contacts were made running about 100 watts to the inverted "L". The great majority (86%) were with U.S.A. and Canadian stations. The Europeans worked (8%) included the Azores (CU), France (F) and two new ones for me, Scotland (GM) and the Isle of Man (GD).

There were also single contacts with South America ---Netherlands Antilles (PJ2), Africa---Morocco (CN) and Oceania---Hawaii (KH6). Among the good ones that "got away" were a station in Chile and another in New
