DXing 50 Years Ago

--- During PEAK of Solar Cycle 19 ---

H F CONDITIONS

The graph of the Solar Flux Index peak of early April fell off to a valley that lasted about a week during the middle of the month and reached a low of 75. The index then climbed fairly guickly to another peak of 100 + for about five days. It has started down again, seemingly following much the same slope as the decline of the April peak. This can be accounted for by the fact that the somewhat moderate spots that have rotated off the Earth-facing side of the Sun have been followed by groups of small spots similar to last month. Tad Cook – K9RA, who writes the weekly ARRL Propagation bulletin notes unusually good propagation reports on 20 meters that he had received in ARLP018. Those reports were associated with a period of "no notable geomagnetic activity". When "....the high latitude college K index was 0 for 51 continuous hours." centered around April 30th. It is a Polar Path from British Columbia to Europe and Paul -VE7BZ reported that on that date he "called CQ once at 0300Z and four hours later \dots I was still working down an endless pileup.

Normally for us—living this far north—20m phone is usually dead in our evenings, but such was not the case...." Also, Richard – HS0ZFO reports from Thailand "hearing stateside signals all over the place on 20 meter SSB starting about 1300Z...." He further reports Charlie – VR2XMT ... "in Hong Kong was running USA stations and so were a couple of the Russian big guns. I had not heard conditions like that since I got on the air here last October." It pays to LISTEN. Wish I had been!

For five days at W9LYN there was emphasis on trying to work the rare operation on Aves Island – YV0. Between April 23rd and 28th they were worked on 80, 30, 17, 15, and 12 meters which were bands on which I do not have that entity confirmed. Interestingly, they were worked on 12 and heard on 10 meters where the W6ELProp program that I talked about and demonstrated at a M.A.R.K. meeting several years ago predicted that there would be NO openings. This is a partial answer to Sam – K3BY's question at the time of: "How accurate is the program." The transportation for the operation was provided by the Venezuelan Navy. They had barely gotten on the air with the pileups going fast and furious when they disappeared. It turned out that their absence from the bands was because Jose – YV5LIX had suffered a fatal heart attack. Even though there were two MD's among the operators they were unable to revive him. The operation started as YX0A but they were given permission to use the call YX0LIX in memory of Jose.

Other activity during the month at W9LYN included 30 meter contacts with stations in Estonia, Mauritius Island and Cuba; and 17 meter QSO's with Honduras, Sweden, England, Peru, Nicaragua, Norfolk Island and St. Helena Island.

SAGO MINE EXPLOSION SURVIVOR

This week's ARRL LETTER (Vol. 25 No. 18 of May 5, 2006) reports that Randall McCloy, Jr. – KC8VKZ "—has expressed his sorrow to the victims' families and shared his personal recollections of the tragedy." In a letter of April 26 the Associated Press reports him writing: "I cannot explain why I was spared while the others perished." Following weeks of hospital treatment and rehabilitation, McCloy, 26, is still recovering from the ordeal.
