

I have a Thunderbird 3 element trapped 10/15/20 meter beam for sale. It has about 50 + feet of 5U ? (forgot) :-) feed cable with a multiloop balun coil at the antenna. Also included is a rotor and control box.

During a storm a few years back the wind broke my wooden mast and the beam came down. It bent the 1 1/2 aluminum boom but did NOT break it. It can be straightened and fixed. None of the elements were damaged. I reinstalled the driven element only on a shortened mast. and the rest is laying on top of my chicken house.

I think I even have the original installation papers somewhere. The tower can be easily lowered and the driven element removed with the cables. I am 88 years old now. My days of antenna building are over. Should make a nice antenna for someone. Price is negotiable.
