OTHER THINGS

LOANER 2 METER RIGS FROM LARK

Here's another advantage of being a LARK member in good standing. The Klub has available to its members several "loaner" two meter rigs. You don't need to be off the air when your radio is being repaired. Contact the technical director for details.

MONITORING HELP

We are attempting to track down the source of the intermittent receiver desensitizing issue the LARK 146.68 repeater currently faces. Our first steps involved verifying that we were not the source of the problem (these things do happen).

Our second step has been to verify that this is not a result of some very strange mix or intermodulation component. Although this is not likely, due to the characteristics of the interference, it did have to be checked.

Our third step will involve monitoring specific frequencies also present at the repeater site, and correlate the "on" time of those transmitter(s) with the occurrence of our issue. This will involve active monitoring of about 20 different frequencies, from 150 MHz to 941 MHz. Obviously, this task can be accomplished more effectively by using a team of folks listening to one or two frequencies and the LARK repeater. We'll discuss this briefly at the next regular meeting.

After we identify the source(s), we can approach the agencies that maintain those particular system(s), and ask for their help. Facts are our friends in these types of issues.

RACES Qualifications

The FEMA IS-2 Emergency Preparedness U.S.A. is now back on the FEMA-EMI website. This course is one of the requirements for RACES. Please download the material and then take the test. I have some hard copies available.

Incident Command System

Incident Command System is the standard by which Fire, Police, and EMS conduct business. In order to be of assistance in doing your job with providing emergency communication in a critical incident, you must really understand what is going on, and who is really in charge of the incident. The FEMA IS-195 Incident Command System Course is also on the FEMA-EMI website. Please download the material and then take the test if you have not already

Please don't wait for the real thing and wished that you would have taken the time to attend some training.
