John N8FYL announced that due to the Christmas Holidays, he will move the deadline for inputs for the next issue of the Tuned Circuit to December 26.

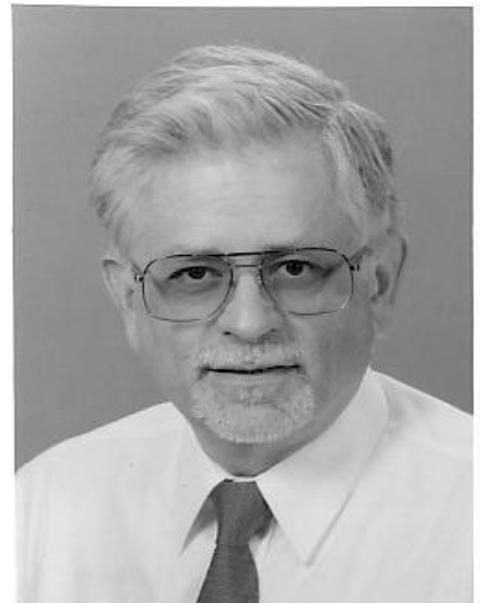
The Macomb Community College Tech Session will not take place this month. The date of the next tech session will be announced after the next school semester begins.

Winter Field Day is Coming!

Yes, that is **not** a type-o. There really is an event called WINTER FIELD DAY. It is almost like regular Field Day that we all go to in June except it is held in January. Different weather of course but the same goal, although the contest is NOT limited to the US [and Canada Ed.] only. World wide contacts count towards your total score. Unlike summer field day, a lot of operators like to talk to their contact stations about their antenna, radio, weather, etc. The USECA club goes up to Camp Ozanam which is in Port Sanilac on Lake Huron. The camp is a boy/girl scout camp in spring, summer and fall. Normally closed in winter, the camp is open just for us. There are heated cabins, several to choose from, a large food hall that we all eat in, a lot of room for antennas and every mode & band you want to operate. We do SSB, AM, FM, CW, DIGITAL, SATELLITE, on 160, 80, 40, 20, 15, 10, 6, 2 Meter bands. Not much activity on 70cm up there but nobody has really tried in the past probably due to the cold weather challenge of setting up a YAGI for that band. One year somebody tried two soup cans with a very long string. Its amazing that we really put up antennas in the snow & cold, but during an emergency the weather usually doesn't cooperate. You won't be cold! I hate the cold and I have never been cold at my station during the contest. The building I stay in is nice and toasty. The only time I get cold is when I'm putting up or taking down my antenna which really doesn't take more than 10 minutes. I bring my 1/2 wave vertical which has worked great for me in the past. Plus we help each other so the job goes fast. The cost for the event is \$20 but all that money, every cent, is given to the Camp Ozanam people for letting us use their great place. I'm sure they don't make any money for heating all the cabins would be the major expense for them. The only thing you need to bring if you just want to be a visiting operator is a sleeping bag, change of clothes, pillow, personal items, a dish or beverage to pass at dinner (not 1 bag of chips or 1 bottle of pop), and \$20. If you want to bring a station that is fine also. There is plenty of room for antennas of all types. It would be great if you could attend the USECA January meeting on the 14th when the club makes the final plans for the event. Everybody that has attended in the past returns the next year, I think because it's so much fun just getting away to a remote cabin in the woods while being able to see Lake Huron while talking to another station in some other state or country. Last year I made about 150 contacts, mostly different countries but a lot of states too. And such good food and company. Saturday lunch and dinner and Sunday breakfast are provided. Real good food, not just hot dogs, pizza or warm beer. The drive up there takes about 1-1/2 hours during normal weather, but I seem to hit a winter storm every year in Port Huron so it takes me a little longer. Think about coming up this year (2013) and helping out the many stations. It's NO fun being stuck at one station when nobody wants to help you out and give you a break from operating, kind of like summer field day.

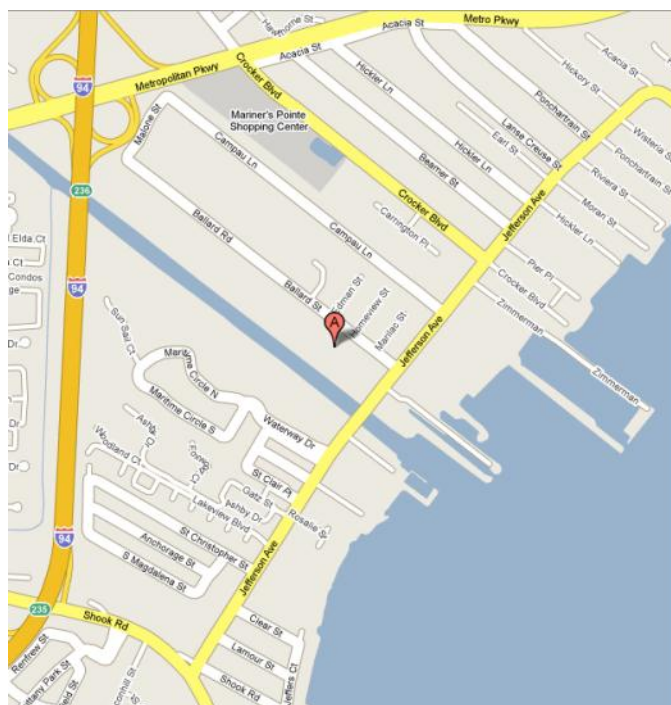
