

## FEBRUARY MEETING PROGRAM

It's back! Yep, the long awaited "White Elephant" sale will take place at the February 6th meeting. Most members know what this is, but for the few who are not familiar with the "sale", here are a few simple rules.


## Membership Report

## Announcing a new SSTV Contest—submitted by Ted/NW8W

Hi,

I'd like to announce a new contest for SSTV, the WSSTVC 15-Meter SSTV Dash Contest, which will be held twice yearly - once in the Spring and once in the Fall.

The Contest, organized by the World Slow-Scan Television Club, will be held in the 15-meter amateur band only and the recommended modes are the fastest B/W or Robot modes, namely Robot 8, Robot 12 or Robot 24. These modes enable the contester to make a QSO in as short a time as possible: this should introduce a bit of spice to the competition. Contesters who do not have these modes may be encouraged to try them out, but in fact any analog SSTV mode would be acceptable in the Contest. Just be aware that the slower the mode a contester uses, the fewer QSOs he/she may be able to make during the Contest, hi.

We discussed some ways to get members that have left the club to rejoin. We discussed drafting a letter and mailing to old members (to make them aware of our activities and meeting places) and the possibility of resurrecting the clubs tri-fold pamphlet that we once had and mailing that out. Cathy is going to look for the trifold. We need get old mailing lists, review and then mail out the trifold or letters. We also discussed the possibility of getting a few more tri-folds printed than we would mail out and then have them available when we go to swaps or at Field Day.


## LCARC Recognized for 2012 Michigan QSO Party Achievements




