

Repeater report Your Secretary fixed the repeater and the noise is gone, (smegma on the DB9 connector) .UHF machine did not have use of its pre-amp due to a defective power switch on the distribution box. A team effort was all that required to remedy the situation. A calibrated weak signal (N8HUL) was used to determine there was improvement after the fix. The UHF repeater was changed to another installed antenna. On the VHF side, several boards were added, a voter and receivers for future remote receiver links, were installed and tested.



Peach of a Ride

Hi to one and all:

The 2013 Slow Spokes Peach of a Ride will be Sunday. August. 25, 2013.

I am still looking for operators to ride in sag vehicles and rest stop operators for the Slow Spokes Peach of a Ride. Some of you have helped in the past and I would like to have you back again this year, along with anyone else that would like to help. Here are the details.



The riders like knowing we are out there keeping an eye on things and are available in case of a problem. There will be 23, 32, 60, 100 mile paved routes. and a 26 mile dirt route.

A mobile radio with a mag mount antenna works best for sags. If you are stationed at a rest stop a mobile rig and an antenna that can be raised 15 or more feet would be good. We may use a simplex frequency as some of the stops are quite a distance. If you have a preference for sag or rest stop I will try to accommodate you if the position is not taken.

Meet at 7 AM at the Memphis Jr. High School 34165 Bordman Rd. Memphis MI, 48041 (west of Memphis). Riders are to be finished by 4 PM. Memphis is north of Richmond on M-19.

We will use 147.300 with 100 HZ.PL tone. This usually seems to work the best for this area. Also have 146.58 simplex in your radio just in case. Talk in will be 147.200 with 100 HZ. PL.


