

Well as I announced at the February club meeting, I have been smoke free for 41 days. A major accomplishment for me. I had no intentions on quitting smoking but the events leading up to my quitting just seamed to fall into place. The whole thing started with myself and XYL's airplane trip to Saint Paul Minnesota to visit our son and daughter-in-law for Christmas and New Years. A long complicated story but in a nut shell we spent 9-1/2 hours inside the Detroit and Chicago airports waiting for airplanes that they were having mechanical problems. Being a smoker I can go several hours without having a "smoke break". Especially while inside an airport after going through airport security, which is not an easy thing to do anymore. Just about every airport in the county has NO SMOK-ING inside and within 25 yards of any building entrance. I guess jet fuel exhaust is better to inhale than cigarette smoke. Anyways I love to fly and I always get a window seat with my nose glued to the window. I don't even think about when I'll be able to smoke once outside the airports. Well we finally got to Minnesota and I realized I was not craving a smoke. So I just didn't smoke and the past 9-1/2 hours led to a full 24 hours, without a cigarette. So I just continued not to smoke. I was getting a little "on edge" and my daughter-in-law's brother told me about the electronic cigarette which does not have all the nasty stuff inside that regular tobacco cigarettes have. So I tried the electronic cigarette and it tastes worse than the real thing, I still take 1-2 puffs a day of the electronic cigarette but I sometimes forget so it is not an everyday thing. My main craving is after meals and with the first drink of my peppermint schnapps happy hour drink, but the craving goes away when I have two or more shots of schnapps. I've noticed if I chew my food slower and take my time eating to enjoy my food I don't crave a smoke so much after. My mother taught me to chew each bite of food at least 20 times so eating slower is not to hard for me. Some foods don't need to be chewed 20 times (like apple sauce, soup, oysters, liquids) and that's a hard thing to slow down with. But I just take one day at a time and soon I'll be able to be outside enjoying the weather more and be able to do all kinds of things without smoking. I know I can be a non-smoker. Hell, if learned Morse code and studied for my ham radio license. I can do anything!

These classes are free and open to anyone with an interest in Skywarn. They will be of special interest to first responders, science teachers, amateur radio operators, outdoor enthusiasts and anyone interested in weather.

Skywarn is a nationwide network of volunteer weather spotters who report to and are trained by NO-AA's National Weather Service (NWS). These spotters report many forms of significant or severe weather such as Severe Thunderstorms, Tornadoes, Hail, Heavy Snow, and Flooding.






