The monthly board meeting will be on Wednesday, August 13th, 2014.


JUNE 4TH MEETING PROGRAM

Peach of a Ride

Hi to one and all:

The 2014 <u>Slow Spokes</u> Peach of a Ride will be Sun. Aug. 24, 2014.

It's time to start recruiting radio operators to ride in sag vehicles and rest stop operators for the <u>Slow</u> <u>Spokes</u> Peach of a Ride. I am looking for any Ham Radio operators interested in helping with this years event. Here are the details.

The riders like knowing we are out there keeping an eye on things and are available in case of a problem. There will be 23, 32, 60, 100 mile routes.

A mobile radio with mag mount antenna works best for sags. Sag operators will ride with a driver in their vehicle unless you prefer using your vehicle. If you are stationed at a rest stop a mobile rig and an antenna that can be raised 15 or more feet would be good. We may use a simplex frequency as some of the stops are quit a distance. If you have a preference for sag or rest stop I will try to accommodate if the position is not taken.

Meet at Memphis Jr. High School 34165 Bordman Rd. Memphis Mi. 48041 West of Memphis at 7 am. Riders are to be finished by 4pm. Memphis is North of Richmond on M-19.

We will use 147.300 with 100hz.pl., this usually seems to work the best for this area. Also have 146.58 simplex in your radio just in case. Talk in will be 147.200 with 100 hz. pl.




2014 LCARC Fox Hunt is June 4th

Prepare for our club Fox Hunt coming at our next meeting. It starts just after the General Club Meeting. It is made up of the Fox (hidden transmitter) and the Hounds (people with direction finding equipment).

The map below shows the 2013 LCARC Fox Hunt layout. The Fox (Marty / K8HVI) was hiding at (B) and the Hounds started at (A). The Fox was 3.75 miles by line of sight and 5.1 miles by the best road path.



The rules for our Fox Hunt are simple. The Fox will hide within a 5 mile radius of the starting point (our General Meeting location). The Fox transmits on 2 meters simplex, on and off throughout the event. 2012 and prior, the Fox would have to bring their own radios and antennas at their determined site. For 2013, Doug / N8PYN built a self-contained Fox transmitter that operates automatically. With that in mind, I turned the Fox location into a two stage event. First, they would need to find me, parked in my car. Then they would have to go on foot out into the park to find the small self-contained transmitter. I selected the George George Park which is on Moravian Dr. just south of Cass Ave. I parked my vehicle in the parking lot and then put the transmitter about 300 feet into the park and 7 feet off the ground in a tree limb.

All Hounds start at the same time. A Hound is made up of a vehicle with 1 to many hams inside. In that group, they split up the duties which include: drive the car (safely!!), rotate the beam antenna, read maps, etc. We have two classes of Hounds, those with Doppler equipment and all others. After the General Meeting is finished, all the participants head out to their vehicles to get the equipment ready. They also set their trip odometer to zero so we can track the distance they drove before they found the

Fox. All the Hounds start at the same time when the Fox tells them "GO". Note, the Fox remains at the site until all participants find the fox, or it gets too dark.

I started the timer clock at 8:20pm, started the transmitter, and the fun began. Sure enough, the Hounds start showing up. They got out of their vehicle and headed into the park to find the transmitter. Once found, I documented it all and then the Hounds headed to the after-party restaurant for pizza and drinks.




