

### Why You Should Get Your Extra Class License

The Amateur Extra Class license is the highest | upgrade to Extra? class of license in the United States, and perhaps the world. Many hams-even hams that live outside the U.S.-aspire to pass the test and be awarded one.

There wasn't always an Amateur Extra Class license. The Extra class license, as we know it today, was created as part of the 1951 license restructuring, that also created the Novice and Technician Class licenses. (In 1951, the Novice license was the "beginner's license." To get a Technician Class license, you had to pass the written test that General Class operators had to pass.)

Although it gave an operator no additional privileges, to get an Extra Class license, one had to:

- Pass a 20 wpm code test (Generals had to • pass only a 13 wpm code test).
- Pass a longer and more difficult written examination than the General Class exam.
- Have at least two years of experience as a licensed radio amateur.

Today, without the code test and the experience requirement, many hams upgrade to Extra Class as soon as they can. Some even pass the Technician Class, General Class, and the Amateur Extra Class exams in a single test session.

So, what's the attraction? Why should you

One of the reasons that you should upgrade to Extra is that you get use of the entire 80 m, 40 m, 20 m, and 15 m bands. Portions of those bands, such as 3.6 - 3.7 MHz in the 75m band and 14.150 - 14.175 Mhz in the 20m phone band. are reserved exclusively for Extra Class licensees. Extra Class operators also have exclusive privileges in the CW portions of the 80 m, 40 m, 20 m, and 15 m bands. These are the frequencies where the DX stations hang out.

Another reason to get your Extra Class license is that only Extra Class licensees can administer General Class and Extra Class license exams. General Class operators can become Volunteer Examiners (VEs), but they are only allowed to administer Technician Class exams.

Another reason you might want to get an Extra Class license is to get a fancy vanity callsign. Only Extra Class operators can apply for 1×2 or 2×1 callsigns, such as W8RP or KT8K. A short, snappy callsign can help you work more DX or improve your contest scores.

Whatever your reason, studying for the Extra Class exam will open your eyes to many aspects of the hobby that you may not be familiar with. And, as you work your way through the material, you'll learn things that make you a better amateur radio operator and enable you to enjoy the hobby more. It's not easy, but in the end, an Extra Class license will help you have more fun with amateur radio.

### The "Reykjavik trick" for exploiting UTC

I recently wanted to add a repeating event to my Google calendar. I wanted the event to be the same UTC time whether we were on Daylight Saving Time, or not, so that the calendar would show the correct local time for the event and alert me accordingly. The solution I found was referred to somewhere on the web as "The Reykjavik Trick". When specifying the time for an event, the Google calendar app allows one to use an alternate time zone. All I needed was to use a city or country in the "GMT" time zone that did NOT use Daylight Saving Time. Iceland, whose capital is Reykjavik, is such a country! The "Iceland trick" doesn't quite roll off the English speakers tongue like "Reykjavik Trick" does, which I suspect is why the method received this name. For what it's worth, they don't observe Daylight Saving Time in Timbuktu, which is in Mali, either, . Also, Burkina Faso, Gambia, Ghana, Guinea, Ivory Coast, Liberia, Mauritania all use GMT time. They are all clustered together in western Africa and do not observe Daylight Saving Time. Pick your favorite location and enjoy the "Reykjavik Trick".

### To the hams of Michigan

(received on 3/22/2016)

This is a special note that concerns NPOTA operation in the Michigan National Parks, National Historical Parks, National Scenic Trails, National Lakeshores, Affiliated Areas, and Battlefield Parks.

Recently a situation developed at one of our parks where an operator who had permission to operate was challenged by local police as a result of a call from an unknown person who thought the operation by the ham was "suspicious". Unfortunately there was a breakdown in communication within the park employees as they had not been told that the amateur would be operating from their park. The situation was easily diffused by the amateur packing up and leaving the park.



As a result of inquiries by a Michigan ARRL staff member, accurate information was determined and the Park personnel responded by resolving to give a written document to any amateurs who request and receive permission to operate at this location. This was an easy solution to a potentially large problem.

To that end, I suggest that any amateur who desires to operate from any of Michigan's NPOTA entities to be certain to check into the appropriate National Park office (where such offices exist) and in the process of requesting permission to operate also request something in writing stating that they have permission to operate. This will help ensure that the same situation does not occur again.

The North Country National Scenic Trail wanders from the Michigan/Ohio line all the way to the Michigan/Wisconsin line. Some parts of the trail are inaccessible as there are portions of the trail that are on private land. The primary trail office is located in Lowell, Michigan but if there is a local trail office, you should contact them regarding operation from the NCST.

I know many interested hams are anxiously awaiting warmer weather to activate various areas across the state. There is some work currently being done on a "light up the trail" effort for the North Country National Scenic Trail from New York to North Dakota possible in early June. 
