Have you wondered exactly what its all about? I have, and on April 25th I was able to attend my first "Lab Tech Night".



Above is the entrance to the Advanced Technology Center building. From the lobby, head through the door to the right, labeled "R". Turn left immediately and soon you will see:





Enter and pick out a spot to work on your project. Nice wood top, tall work surfaces with plenty of 120 volt outlets, and even a PC if you need to look up something on the Internet.



It's not easy tell from the size of the photo but there is a Ten-Tec Paragon, power supply, a HeathKit receiver, a 2 meter FM radio, a CanTenna dummy load and assorted other amateur related equipment stored in this cabinet. Since JohnN8NXW unlocked it when we were there, I assume it is locked most of the time for safekeeping.

I worked on the DSO138 <u>Digital oscilloscope kit</u> I've had for a while. Using a soldering station from the college's equipment supply, I was able to make progress with the first surface mount parts work I have ever done. Wow, those chip resistors, in the **O** are small. I'm sure glad the kit included some extras because one managed to disappear! In this kit these resistors are about the size of half a grain of rice!

The height of the work surface and the lighting in the room made it easier for me than if I was working in my home.

Maybe next month you'll be taking advantage of this resource to make progress on one of your ham projects.

It was a beautiful spring day on Saturday. Matt KD8LLT came up for the day. Matt and Doug set up the station on the picnic table using Doug's <u>Kenwood TS-480</u>, a <u>Tigertronics SignaLink</u> and a laptop using <u>N3FJP software</u>. We had three operators and entered as a multi op. We ran SSB on three bands: 20 meters, 40 meters and 80 meters. MIQP is a 12 hour contest to work US states, Canadian provinces and Michigan counties. We started on 20 meters at the beginning of the contest. Switched to 40 meters and then 80 meters later in the event. We logged 182 QSOs with 41 Michigan counties and 33 US States and the DX of US Virgin Islands. A good time was had by all.


