Discussion Topics:

Radio Support American Diabetes Association Event.

John, N8NXW, reported on his efforts to determine the need for radio operators that were requested by the American Diabetes Association. He received no response from the American Diabetes Association representative. The need for radio support at the American Diabetes Association event is the end of September. This is a very short notice for a response from any radio club. Ken, KD8RJN, said that he can post the contact information for the American Diabetes Association on the LCARC web reflector and ask John, N8FYL to email all members. Any LCARC member that wants to volunteer for the event can contact the American Diabetes Association representative directly.

Macomb Community College (MCC).

The Tech Night at MCC is in limbo. MCC may renovate the lab that is used for Tech Night. In the past, John, N8NXW, was able to have access for the club Tech Night because he was doing work for MCC and he was present during Tech Night. John is talking to the full time instructor in charge of the lab about having Tech Night this year. The full time instructor must get permission from the Dean. A lot of discussion about LCARC working more closely with MCC. A close affiliation with MCC would open up the possibilities for moving the repeater to MCC, using an MCC classroom for meetings, and also have hands on activities like a build session of some radio kit. MCC has a formality that must be followed. For MCC and LCARC to be affili-

ated, MCC wants financial details and activity information about LCARC. LCARC cannot provide all the information required by MCC.

If MCC renovates the lab area used for Tech Night, MCC may need to donate equipment. The LCARC agreed to take any equipment that MCC wants to donate to a radio club.

Field Day at Addison Oaks.

John, N8NXW, wants to install a permanent ground rod at the Field Day site. John has an electric jack hammer that can be used for pounding a standard 8 foot ground rod in the ground.

Cathy, KC8WNL, and Gregg, N8GEO, asked about the value of having Field Day at Addison Oaks. About 10 members spend the night and about 16 members are around during the day. The cost for the Field Day site at Addison Oaks is \$500.00. Maybe we should consider another park. For any park, maybe the club and the trailer campers could split the cost.

LCARC Swap.

Mark, N8REZ, agreed to run the kitchen. Cathy, KC8WNL, will help. Ken, KD8RJN, is doing early ticket selling and he needs early coffee from the kitchen.

Christmas Party.

3D Printed Parts for Ham Radio

One of the things that I keep telling myself that I need to learn how to do is 3D printing. This morning, I ran across a couple more 3D printing projects for ham radio that I thought I'd pass along.

The first I found on reddit: 3D Printed Parts for Portable Tape Measure Yagi Designs (https://www.reddit.com/r/amateurradio/comments/963br3/3_printed_parts_for_portable_tape_measure_yagi/). The summary on Thingiverse (<https://www.thingiverse.com/thing:3042505>), which is a website where "makers" share their designs, says:

These parts are made for use with 1-in. PVC pipe and 1-in. Harbor Freight tape measure steel. You can use electrical tape to attach the element holders to the side of the pipe, and use the driven element bridge to give structural rigidity across the driven dipole element. I have used this with up to 5 elements on 2m with good success. When not using the antenna, just pinch the elements to remove them from the holders, and store them INSIDE the tube! you can add some end caps to make this ultra portable. Use these parts with any of the multitude of tape measure YAGI design guides online.

Here's a look at an antenna made with these parts:



The element holders are attached to the boom with electrical tape in the photo above. While I haven't tried it, I'd suggest that the antenna might be a bit more robust if you could screw or perhaps glue the holders to the boom.

There are lots of other cool amateur radio 3D printing projects available on Thingiverse (<https://www.thingiverse.com/search?q=ham+radio&dwh=415b6d8da129c3c>). Browsing through the list quickly, here are just two that look like they might be useful to me:

- Soldering Fingers (<https://www.thingiverse.com/thing:1725308>). This project looks simple and quick.
- µBitx Case (<https://www.thingiverse.com/thing:2925336>). I still gotta do something with the µBitx I bought. This looks like it might get me started.

He is also survived by his elderly father Pop Tart.

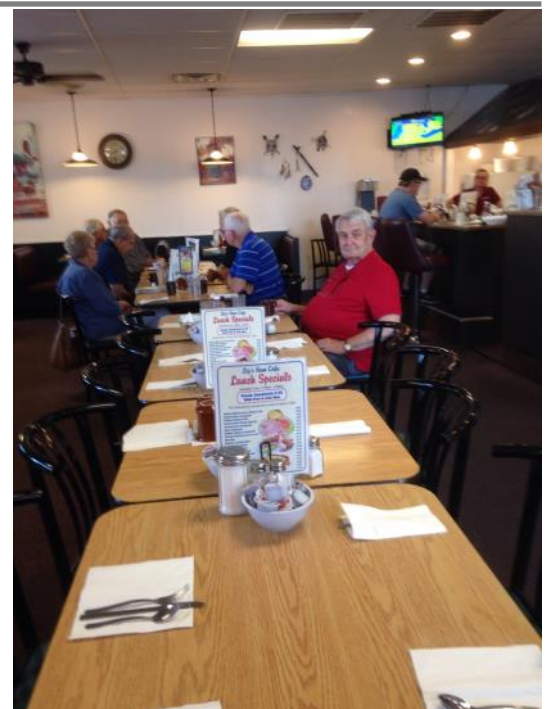
The funeral was held at 3:50 for about 20 minutes.

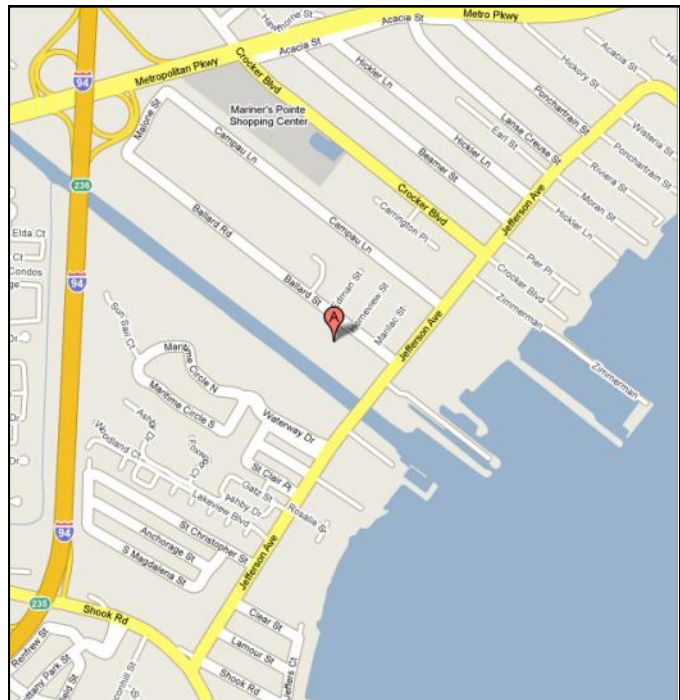
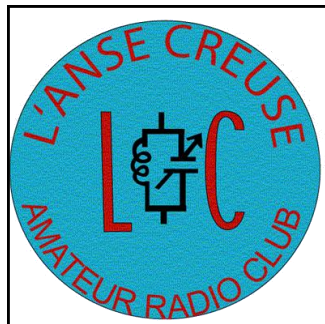
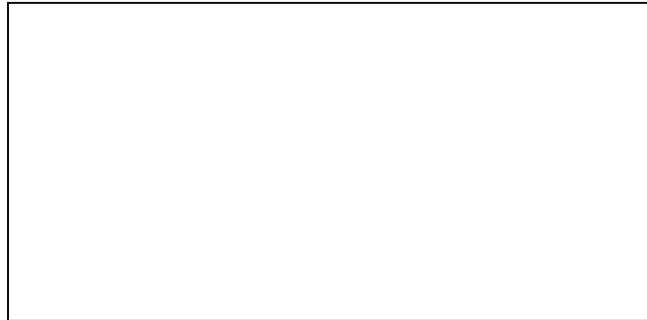
