County-Hunting Mapper

I recently saw a plug for the current version of the <u>County-Hunting Mapper</u> software by EI8IC. The description (from the web site):

Welcome to the <u>'County-Hunting Mapper'</u> - a unique, easy-to-use Amateur Radio program for creating County, State, Section and Grid Locator outline maps of North America that can be filled by Hand, from a contest logger UDP feed, or from imported ADIF or Cabrillo logs.

Create a base map, add text, colors, and lat/lon or Grid Locator lines, then fill regions to create maps that reflect your County Hunting activities, or operating achievements, or contest results: either by hand, or from imported log files, or as those events actually happen, by automatically plotting regions worked during a contest from your N1MM logger, and building up a map that shows the exact state of your contest so far.

You can edit logs, check for errors, parse for counties, export data in different formats, search the county databases, overlay GPS files, export the maps for use in other applications, or to share online. For further reference, see the comprehensive Help Guide

While I have not yet explored this software, I think it is very intriguing, and it's on my "to do" list when I get the proverbial "round tuit". HiHi. This software is not free, but you can trial the program with full functionality for 30 days. After that, you'll need a license. Currently a license is \$15.00 USD paid through Pay-Pal.





DXpedition to use FT8 robot?

August 22, 2019. It's inevitable. At some point, machines are going to render humans irrelevant. It's been a recurring theme in science fiction since before I was born (1955), and there are numerous predictions of the Singularity, the point in time when machines will be smarter than human, occurring between 2030 and 2045.

It may happen in amateur radio sooner than we think. A couple of days ago, one of my readers, sent me a link to a blog post by John, AE5X: <u>Automated FT8 "FoxBot" in upcoming DXpedition – confirmed</u>. He wrote:

"A <u>DXpedition to Tokelau</u> will take place from 1 to 11 October and it will be your chance to work an FT8 robot operating in Fox/Hound mode.

"Stathis SV5DKL has been working on a "FoxBot" for some time now, is listed as a partner to this DXpedition and has confirmed that the DXpedition will be using his FoxBot."

John has since updated this post, noting "The SV5DKL logo has now been removed and the DX team will be in 'full compliance' with the mode." Full compliance meaning following the rules set up by the ARRL DXCC rules.

The ARRL is, of course, against the use of robots. A recent ARRL Letter noted:

"ARRL has incorporated changes to the rules for all ARRL-sponsored contests and DXCC, prohibiting automated contacts and requiring that an actual operator is initiating and carrying out a contact. These changes also apply to Worked All States (including Triple Play and 5-Band WAS), Fred Fish W5FF Memorial, and VUCC awards. The changes are effective immediately and affect the rules for both HF contests, and VHF/UHF contests as well as DXCC.

"A resolution at the July ARRL Board of Directors meeting pointed to 'growing concern over fully automated contacts being made and claimed' for contest and for DXCC credit. The rules now require that each claimed contact include contemporaneous direct initiation by the operator on both sides of the contact. Initiation of a contact may either be local or remote."

As AE5X says, however, the use of FT8 robots in the future is a certainty. Sooner or later, some DXpedition is going to use an FT8 robot without saying anything about it. How is the ARRL going to know that a DXpedition is using robots if the DXpedition operators don't tell them?

I'm wondering when some DXpedition is going to give up on SSB and CW altogether. Why bother with those modes when you can make hundreds or thousands more contacts by just operating FT8?

Another thought just occurred to me. If the ARRL gets its way and Techs are awarded HF digital privileges, how long will it take for some enterprising Tech to make the DXCC Honor Roll using FT8 exclusively. Oh, the horror of it all!

Improved ? RJ45 Connectors

From <u>ARRL Contest Update for September 4, 2019</u> with pictures added by your Editor

Bill, K9HZ, suggested the following on the StepplR reflector:

"The manufacturers of the RJ45's have made it easier on us old guys with failing eyesight over the past few years with ends that are much easier to put on than the originals. The originals required you to cut each wire the proper length and then put all wires together in the proper order in the tight channel of the RJ45 to the right depth and then crimp it.

Of late though, there are two flavors of RJ45 ends that make it a snap. The first kind allows you to make each individual wire as long as you want... then string it into the RJ45 and out through the front (see https://discrete.com/through-th



A second type (see this link for an example - Ed.) has a carrier that you first thread wires of any length through to get them into the right positions, then cut them flush at the front of the carrier and put the carrier into the RJ-45 housing and crimp the whole mess. I've yet to have one of these fail in hundreds of installs. But then there is something to be said for letting someone else do it!"

Editor: The links have more pictures and information. Interesting improvements for those that might need to make some custom cables.


