Report of the Secretary

Meeting Called to Order:

The LCARC President (Ken, KD8RJN) called the 02 October 2019 LCARC general meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

Roll Call. A total of 25 people attended tonight's meeting.

<u>Meeting Minutes Approval</u>. The previous meeting minutes as in the Tuned Circuit News Letter were approved after a motion made by Dennis, KE8FEX, and seconded by Keith, W8KD.

Treasurer's Report by Gregg, N8GEO:

Total amount in the account is \$4581.71 The Youth Fund has \$308.00. The Repeater Fund has \$569.82. Available \$3703.89.

Where's Doug:

The USECA Swap is the next big event in our local area. The date is 27 October 2019 and the location is the same as the upcoming LCARC December Swap.

Repeater Status:

<u>Mi6WAN</u>. Ken, KD8RJN, invited the Mi6WAN representative to attend our meeting tonight. The representative could not make tonight's meeting. One benefit of having Mi6WAN on the N8LC repeater tower is that the repeater shack will have internet access. Ken is going to research other ways to have internet inside the repeater shack.

<u>Repeater Shack Insulation</u>. Ken, KD8RJN, took measurements for installing insulation in the repeater shack using his surplus insulation. Ken also priced some thermostats that can be installed on the repeater shack heaters.

<u>Repeater Noise</u>. Dale, K8RO, said that the repeater noise may be coming from a DTE interrupt transmitter that has a transmit spur. A DTE interrupt transmitter sends a short signal to temporarily interrupt electricity to high electricity demand appliances. This short electrical interruption helps DTE provide reliable service on days when the demand for electricity is high. The national frequency for interrupt transmitters is 154.465 MHz. Dale believes that the spur is from the DTE interrupt transmitter located in Mount Clements.

Dale processed 9 eQSLs this month.



In the News 1952

I belong to several groups relating to TELETYPE machines and Crypto equipment.

In a recent search for information about a teletype decoding device I own, more commonly known as a "Terminal Unit" or simply, a TU, I was directed to an issue of the RTTY Journal, a publication started in California by a ham named Merrill Swan, W6AEE. (No relation to the group or family who started the

company who marketed ham gear under the name of "SWAN.") It was the July, 1960 issue. (A few years before I was licensed!)

I found the four or five pages I needed to add to the modest data base I had for the device and spent a few minutes leafing through the rest of the magazine.

I found one spot that showed the attendance at two different "Teletype Dinners." Each event seemed to have around 30 to 40 in attendance. There was a name/call list provided for each event.

One name on one of the events literally jumped off the page and got my attention. Kurt Carlsen - W2ZXM. This man happened to be the 'friend of a friend'. My friend in this area, Ed McKenzie, W8DU, (SK-2001) and Kurt had chatted a number of times on CW and had also met in person. Ed showed me the QSL card he had received from Kurt.

Now, for what I consider to be the exciting part of this article:

(Henrik) Kurt Carlsen (1914 - 1989) was a Danish-born sea captain. He went into the Danish merchant fleet at age 14 and by age 22 was a ship master.

He came to the forefront of world-wide news in 1952, when he declined to leave his merchant ship, the "<u>Flying Enterprise</u>" as it foundered in the rough seas of a terrible storm in the Atlantic. He got help to the scene and made certain that the few passengers and all of the crew were safely taken aboard the rescue vessels but stayed behind to do what he could to keep the ship afloat and possibly get it towed to port. Much of the newsworthy aspects of the event took place within 50 or 60 miles of several European ports. A tugboat was on the scene, and they did manage to get a 5-inch tow cable strung between the two vessels. But the heavy winds and huge waves had their way, and the 5-inch cable broke. (Now make a 5-inch circle with your hands and fingers and imagine the force necessary to cause such a rope/ cable to snap!)

At some point, Captain Carlsen realized that the ship could not be saved and got aboard one of the rescue vessels. Sadly, they watched the huge waves and wind do their damage to the ship and it finally foundered and went down, and much of its precious cargo got out of the holds and was scattered across the sea.

Captain Carlsen got a hero's welcome in London, I think it was, then another in New York, when he got back to the US.

I found a few newsreels on the internet and am including the links to the YouTube pages where they may be viewed.

I hope that any of the readers who may be anywhere near my age will remember the events of 1952 and may have also seen some of this firsthand on TV and at the movies. Newsreels were quite common back in the 1950s.
