The LCARC President (John/N8NXW) called the November 10th, 2021 LCARC Board Meeting to order at 7:58 PM. Meeting was held in person at Roseann's Kitchen Cafe.

Present were

John/N8NXW, Dale/K8RO, Doug/N8PYN, Cathy/KC8WNK, Russ/N8HAR, Keith/W8KD, Dennis/WC8C and Gregg/N8GEO.

Russ updated us on the Swap. 33 tables have been paid for so far. Gregg stated that Mark/ N8REZ is in good shape getting everything he needs for the concessions. Russ still has some soft drinks at his house to add to the concessions inventory. Dale stated they will have a tech session coming up and can get all the swap stuff stored there inventoried. Russ brought up that we might need to take money back out of the repeater project if the swap turns out to be a loss. Most board members believe we should be fine and if needed, we will be able to pay the bills for the swap. Lastly, Russ brought up he has swap flyers to take and put out and about to advertise.

Gregg stated he is still working with the Civil Air Patrol to see what needs that they might have and if we are able to help them.

Dale said at the upcoming Tech Session they will get the repeater ready for winter. Install heaters and the insulation blanket. Also, working on the power supply upgrades to the new ones.

Gregg brought up that more people need to try to send in content to the Tuned Circuit to help John/N8FYL with articles he can publish that he doesn't have to personally go and source.

Marty updated on the repeater antenna project status. Still nothing new on getting a company to finish the work. The current vendor is still MIA [Ed. Missing In Action]. He has not followed up on his prior statement that he would help get us connected with a vendor that could do the work.

John/N8NXW brought up the antennas and tower at the college. Gregg said that he checked with our insurance and they said we are not covered to take the tower down for the college. Also, does the club even have a plan for the antennas and/or the tower? Where would we even put it? How will it get moved (trailers & manpower)? John will circle back with the college and update us next month.

Dennis asked if we will need a program for the December club meeting. We agreed that he could get a short program. He will try to get a 25 minute presentation on Smith charts. Dale asked Dennis to send a note to John/N8FYL to inform the club about the December program in the Tuned Circuit.

Dale brought up our club e-storage research on using Sync. We are still experimenting with it.

Dale brought up that we still need a club Secretary for next year.

Dale stated this year's Christmas Party will be at Penne Lane on December 8th. They will be collecting money at the door (\$25 per person). (no advance ticket purchases)

Russ asked Gregg to send in an updated testing dates pdf for the club website. The dates out there now are old. [Editor: the website was updated on November 18th.]

Russ stated we will need vendor direction signs outside at the swap. Also, will need a person to man the door outside to control the vendor parking so it doesn't get clogged. We still don't know yet if we will have access on Saturday for setup. Timing for this is still to be determined.



The "D" indicates a duplex capability (see below) and the "W" indicates wireless operation capability. Otherwise runs on a user supplied USB cable. This is because there are a number of slightly different USB combinations and Brother didn't want to supply a handful of connection cables. [The internet also indicates Ethernet connectivity too. Editor]

It has never been out of the box! The box has been opened strictly for access to the plastic envelope with instructions and a standard size CD-ROM disk with drivers and other software for the printer. The AC power cord is still all "hanked" up with twisty tie from the factory. These items are in a small compartment in the packing, which is accessible once the four cardboard covers are opened.



This printer will connect to both the PC world and to Macintosh computers.

Now asking \$125 for this fine printer. That's a 16% savings from the original ask of \$150!

NOTE: This is a black & white printer only. No possible option for multi-color printing.

This is a situation where I can't give you a demonstration since that would sort of end the "New in Box" status. Warranty papers are part of the items in the plastic envelope.

The "DW" model has a duplexer which allows dual side printing without running paper through two times manually. I have never done this so I can't say much else.

One online review indicates a printing speed of over 25 pages per minute. If my math is correct that equals one copy every 2.4 seconds.

I hope I've covered all important things. Since I've never used it, I have no history to relate.



Gott-Goldberg-Vanderbei Projection

Princeton professors J. Richard Gott and Robert Vanderbei worked with Drexel professor David Goldberg to create a revolutionary new map: a two-sided disk that can slip inside a textbook or be stacked neatly for storage. It provides more accurate distances than any existing flat map, while keeping visual distortions at a minimum.

Their new map is two-sided and round, like a phonograph record or vinyl LP. Like many radical developments, it seems obvious in hindsight. Why not have a two-sided map that shows both sides of the globe? It breaks away from the limits of two dimensions without losing any of the logistical convenience — storage and manufacture — of a flat map.



It improves geographical parity between continents, finally representing the southern hemisphere as fairly as possible on paper.

The map can be printed front-and-back on a single magazine page, ready for the reader to cut out. The three cartographers imagine printing their maps on cardboard or plastic and then stacking them like records, to be stored together in a box or slipped inside the covers of textbooks.

Enter your Zip Code and the "within" distance, and click SEARCH. When I did it with Zip 48045 (the zip code for the Tucker Senior Center), and a "within 50 miles", it reported a number of sessions spanning the time until a year from now.


