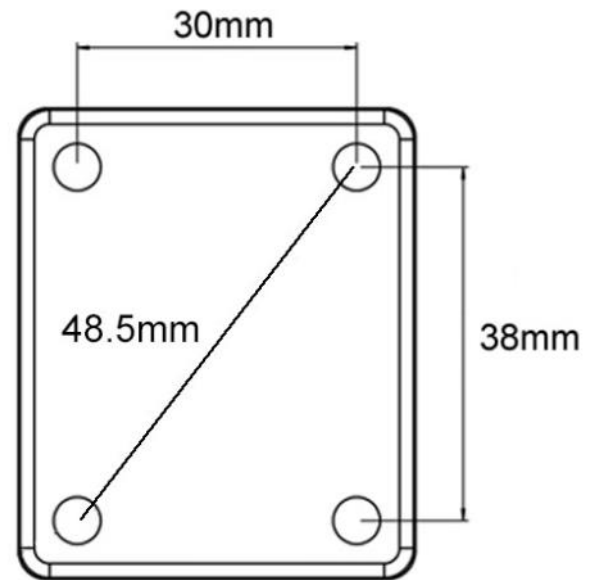
Standards— There are so many!

There is no defined standard for GPS mounts in the same way that the VESA exists for monitor mounts. Device manufacturers such as Garmin and TomTom have settled on the 4-Hole pattern in their device cradles and it has become a default standard in the market over time for many other types of devices too.

The AMPS hole pattern consists of four holes arranged in a rectangular pattern that are spaced 38mm x 30mm (1.188" x 1.5") apart. A 2-Hole AMPS pattern which describes the diagonal of the 4-Hole version with 2 holes spaced at 48.5mm (1.912") apart.

Here is a nice [PDF](#) from Panavise with some more information.



You might be wondering how I stumbled on this AMPS hole pattern “standard”. Even if you weren’t wondering, I’m going to tell you anyway!

I was researching methods to secure the remote head of my ICOM IC-2720 dual band mobile rig without occupying a cup holder. I was checking out the Lido mounts at DX Engineering and came across this [LM-WEDGE](#) mount for HT’s and Remote Heads. It is a very intriguing item that I will probably try out. But in the investigation I kept seeing references to the “4 Hole AMPS pattern”, so I used “The Google” and thus I, and now you, know what that pattern is.

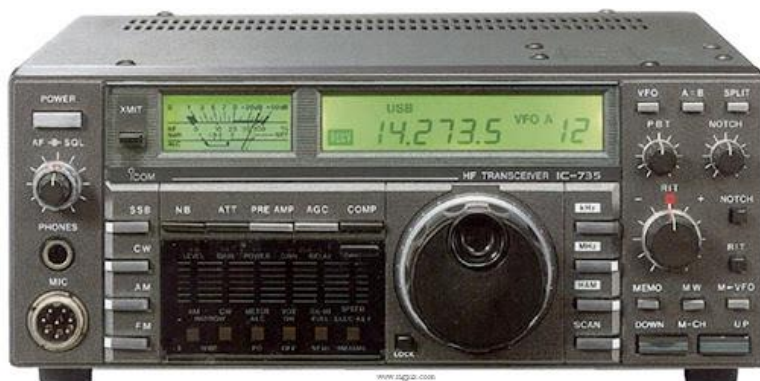

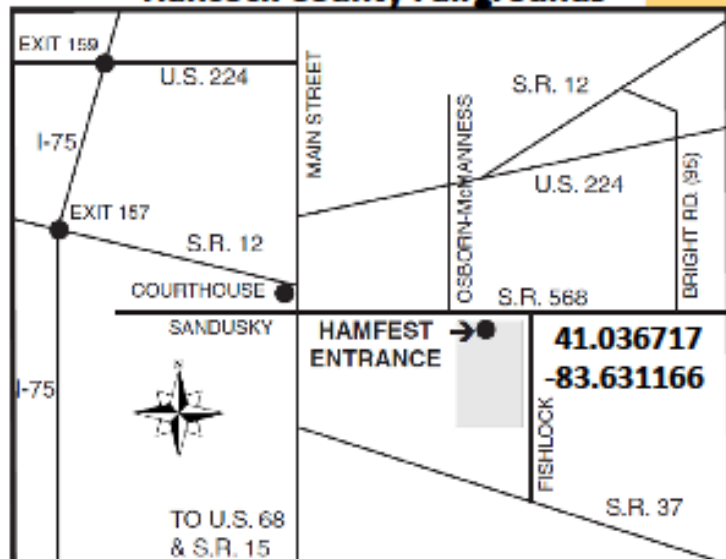

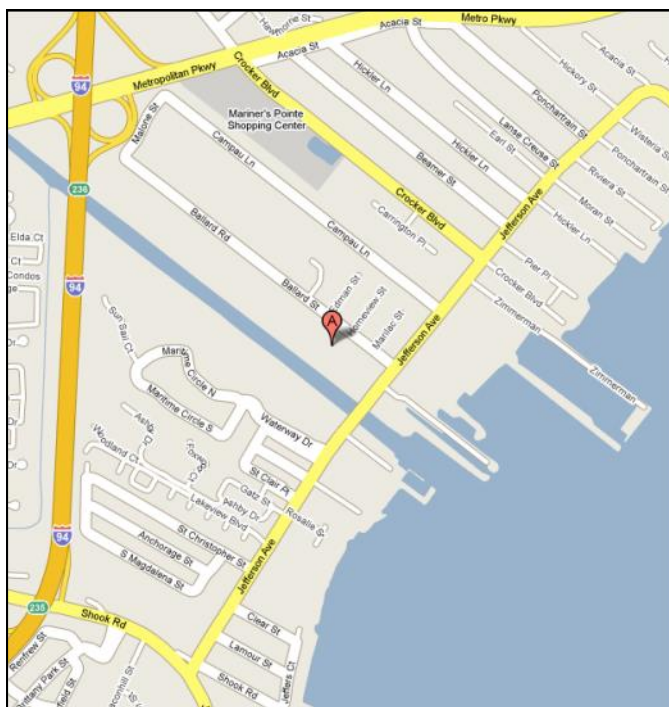
