He was a renown local billiard player in his 20's and 30's and met Minnesota Fats. 






Below is the Micro Bitx transceiver built by Dennis/WC8C.

The great circle path to each contact is shown on the map. Thus after working a DX contest and analyzing your log, you can get a good idea of exactly where in the world your signal can be heard. A number of other statistics are also available. Your map is stored for later reference for at least a month. You can check out my map for the 2022 ARRL DX CW contest here (while it lasts.) Enjoy!


