ARRL Liaison report: Keith/W8KD

ARRL has established 2023 as The Year of the Volunteer. Several activities related to this will be he Volunteer on the Air (Details in *The Tuned Circuit*)

- The month of January will have Kids Day on the 7th, RTTY Round Up on the 7th and 8th, and the VHF contest is on the 21st and 22nd.
- Bill Johnson of US House District 6 of Ohio has introduced a bill to eliminate the private land restrictions for ham radio operators for antennas.
- U.S. Congresswoman Debbie Lesko (AZ-08) introduced the Amateur Radio Communications
 Improvement Act to eliminate the current symbol rate limit set by the Federal Communications
 Commission (FCC) and replace it with a 2.8 kilohertz (kHz) bandwidth limit. The bill brings
 regulations up to speed with modern technological advances in amateur radio.
- There are 9 special event stations and 36 contests left in the month of January.

A Year-Long
Operating Event
Recognizing
Volunteers



As announced in the January 2023 issue of QST (<u>announcement link</u>), ARRL is celebrating a year-long operating event honoring all ARRL volunteers: Volunteers On the Air.

In similar fashion to the 2014 ARRL Centennial Celebration, and the 2018 International Grid Chase, this event will be exclusively driven only by QSOs uploaded to Logbook of The World (LoTW).

Highlights of the event include:

- Earning Points for contacting W1AW Portable Stations: There will be week-long activations of portable W1AW/# stations in all 50 states, and in several US Possessions/Territories, that will generate on-air activity to earn points. Each state will be activated twice. The schedule of when which states will be activated as posted in the dashboard above will be updated as changes/additions occur. See the POINTS TABLE for the full list of points.
- Contacting ARRL Volunteers or Members on the air: ARRL Officers, Directors, Section Managers
 (and their appointees), Staff, and even Members domestically (and DX) can be contacted for
 points. See the POINTS TABLE for the full list of points.

Using Logbook of the World (LoTW – see http://www.arrl.org/logbook-of-the-world) as the QSOs data source, the 2023 Volunteers On The Air event features W1AW activations from all 50 states (twice) and several territories during 2023. Weeks will begin on a Wednesday and end on a Tuesday. Some weeks will be shown as off weeks to avoid other major operating events.

Participants will work W1AW portable stations and ARRL volunteers (see links in dashboard at top of this page) to earn QSO points.

Participants do not need to upload to, or participate in LoTW. Uploads to LoTW by W1AW portable stations and by the volunteers will feed the points scoring system. [Participants are not required to be ARRL Members. Even so, we encourage all Amateur Radio operators who are not members to consider joining the comradery with our 160,000+ current members. When joining, you'll discover support, inspiration, and advice to elevate your Amateur Radio experience.]

A Leaderboard will be activated after the event ramps up, and Certificates will be available during and after the event concludes. Once the year is completed, a final summary will be released.

Revisit this page regularly for updates!

This is a great opportunity to pursue a Worked All States in a year (or less) on the modes available. Since the participating stations WILL be using LoTW, you can be assured of a timely confirmation of your valid contacts. If it is anything like the 2014 centennial event, there will be lots of activity on many bands (including WARC) and 10 meters is likely to be open too! Plan your fun! 73, John / N8FYL




Season Closer: On Sunday at 11:59 p.m. (the last minute of Jan. 15) "or until commercial traffic ceases," says the <u>U.S. Army Corps of Engineers</u> this week, the Soo Locks will close for the winter to maritime traffic. That caveat this year for a wee bit of extra time comes along with reports that Lake Superior ports are still hopping with activity. The photo of the Poe Lock "dewatered" and under maintenance work is from a past winter by Carrie Fox. The image of Interlake Steamship Company's *Mark W. Barker*, taken by Scott Bjorklund of <u>Scott's Canal Captures</u> on Monday, shows the Great Lakes' newest vessel (launched in 2022) heading to the Canadian National ore dock #6 in Superior to load iron ore pellets for Cleveland. Once closed for critical maintenance, the Poe and MacArthur locks, the only two still in regular operation, will not open again until spring. The Poe will need to keep its water for some Gate 1 repair work, according to the Corps, and then will be dewatered on Feb. 13. The MacArthur will not be drained this winter. The Poe reopens by 12:01 a.m. on March 25 and the smaller, less used MacArthur will remained closed until April 24. "Federal regulation establishes the operating season based on the feasibility of vessels operating during

typical Great Lakes ice conditions," notes the Corps. Given their druthers, of course, the Corps repair and maintenance crew would love to do its work in the warmer months, but that is when the boats must sail. "Winter weather poses challenges and adds intensity to maintenance, the team is highly skilled and equipped to safely execute critical projects that allow for continued operational reliability," says Soo Locks Operations Manager LeighAnn Ryckeghem. For the crews on the



New Lock (yet unnamed), though, winter means a break. "The Corps of Engineers is building a second Poe-sized lock to provide much needed resiliency in the Great Lakes Navigation System," says the Corps. "The second Poe-size lock, 110-feet by 1,200-feet, is being built on the existing Davis and Sabin Locks sites. The Davis Lock, which opened in 1914, has not been used since 2018, and only to transport Corps vessels. The Sabin Lock opened in 1918 and has been inactive since 1989. Both the Sabin and Davis Locks are too shallow for most modern vessels." The contractor completed the first phase of construction, and the upstream channel deepening was completed in August. The project's second phase to stabilize the existing upstream approach walls ended its second year of work. The contractor installed 26 coffer cells, completing all 52 and placed 31,000 cubic yards of concrete. The upstream approach walls work resumes in spring. "The final phase of construction, constructing the lock chamber," adds the Corps, "was awarded July with mobilization taking place in October/November."


