THE PREZ SEZ

With our November 1st General Club Meeting just a week and change away, remember that you have until this meeting to get your club dues in to remain as a member in good standing. John/N8FYL sent out an email to all with a pre-filled out membership renewal form. So please print it and bring it to the club meeting. Also, you can mail in or even PayPal your dues.



During this past month, efforts at getting the diesel generator up and running have identified that the

motor has multiple frozen/seized parts. Even if purchased new (3 @ \$400 each) that would not ensure that there would be more parts down the line with issues that prevent getting it running. So for now, we consider the generator a no go for further work. We were able to complete the baseline SWR scans for the 4 coax lines to our antennas. This will allow for a future reference to identify any changes to the system by doing another scan and then identify any changes. Also, we created the labels that identify what coax line goes to what antenna. The labels will be put on the coax lines at the radio end and at the building exit to aid identification during future maintenance. Also, we are working on our VPN connection. If anyone is an OpenVPN or similar expert, we would love to pick your brain. Just contact me.

We had a larger group of siren testers for the October 7th test. We had 12 observers and had 4 sirens that didn't pass. Remember, November 4th is our next siren test. We have an online webpage that you can sign up for the siren you want to visit, and you can use it to report your results. <u>9xp9KPRPIEuAVzaOe14OapACI5m3wjJg</u>). We are thinking about having a table at our December Swap to promote the siren testing and to ask the swap attendees if they would like to volunteer. Possibly create some kind of flyer/sheet to hand out from the table. If you are interested in manning the table, please let me know.

Siren Test Reporting Update: Marty/K8HVI provided an update on the Macomb Count Siren Testing. The prior month's testing we had 7 people monitoring and 2 failures were found. The remote switch in the shack is now working to get it to turn over. Validated it had fuel but no oil, a few parts were replaced. At this time, it looks like it is not getting fuel as needed. Work will continue.

Swap Meet: Russ/N8HAR provided an update on the swap. Currently 14 tables are sold. All the positions have been filled by volunteers. We are on track, and everything is moving forward.

Christmas Party: Gregg/N8GEO reported that Mark/N8REZ will attempt to secure the Penne Lane location we have enjoyed the last few years.

Club Badges: Gregg/N8GEO stated we will not be making any more small orders due to cost. We will order more when we have a larger number of members wanting them.

Board Meeting: The Board meeting was planned for Wednesday September 13th on Zoom but a number of the board members were out of town. The meeting was rescheduled and took place on September 25th.

ARRL Report: Keith/W8KD stated Dale Williams, the director of the ARRL Great Lakes Division, has decided to step down. Voting for a replacement is taking place. The Michigan section manager Les Butler/W8MSP has passed away [Editor: March 8, 2023]. Larry Camp/WB8R has been appointed to replace him. The SET (Simulated Emergency Test) program is scheduled for October 7th. There is no plan for Macomb County to participate.

The number of contests is back up and there are 60 planned for this month. Also 50 Special Event Stations for October. VOTA (Volunteers On The Air) is going well.

Treasurer's Report: Current balance is \$6,055.48 which has increased due to swap table sales and membership dues being paid.

Siren Testing: Dale/K8RO and Marty/K8HVI discussed the progress we are making on the siren testing. Several members have made suggestions and provided input to update the database. An improved Excel spreadsheet will be created and run in parallel to improve the process.

A suggestion was made to have a table at the club swap about our siren testing program. We may get additional volunteers to help with testing. We are also planning to send out the results of the testing to everyone in the club and outside volunteers to let them see the success we are having.

Technical Committee: No progress has been made on the generator. Parts are being cleaned and work will continue. Waiting on Ted/K8EO to pick up the cavities for installation at the shack.

Gregg/N8GEO - Stated discussions are taking place on re-installing the controller. He has contacted a controller manufacturer to see what products may work on our system. They are being evaluated by the technical team.

Marty/K8HV - No further work has been performed on the VPN at the repeater site.

Dale/K8RO - May bring a heater to help when working at the shack during the colder months.

Marty/K8HVI - Has created tags for all the coax lines for identification of what they are connected to.

Doug/N8PYN - Has been working on the packet system at the repeater site.

December Club Swap Meet: Russ/N8HAR stated we are in good shape on the swap and table sales. He is also working on an email list of past attendees to help drive sales.

Christmas Party: Gregg/N8GEO stated he contacted Mark/N8REZ and he is waiting for the restaurant to open so he can book the event. Mark is going to manage it and it is on track.

New Officers for 2024: At the last membership meeting Dennis/AC8JH agreed to become the new secretary and Scott/K8VXM will take the President Elect for 2024. We are still in need of an activities manager, and the ARRL liaison.

2 Meter Repeater Interference: Gregg/N8GEO received email about a letter Steve/W1EMI from ARRL sent to the CEO of DTE about our effort to get them to eliminate the interference they are causing.

The Repeater book had our 440 system as inactive. Gregg/N8GEO was able to log in and set it back to active.

Banking Changes: Gregg/N8GEO will be making changes with the bank on who will have access to the club account and have a debit card for purchases.

Donated equipment: Gregg/N8GEO and Dale/K8RO will be picking up the donated equipment near the end of October.

Member Assistance: Gregg/N8GEO has been in contact with Rose/K8VFR. She is going to let her license lapse. He has offered help with her antenna and/or selling any of her equipment.

Open Discussion: Vince/WASBIJ - Asked if the club provides gas cards for presenters that travel to the club meetings. We did have cards but they we used at club meetings for raffle prizes. Most presenters now use Zoom for the meetings.



This week I talk about my small home based manufacturing business and answer the question "Is that a giant pick and place machine in your shop?" (or are you just happy to see me). For the last 20 years I've been collecting equipment that makes small scale manufacturing possible. Sometimes referred to as boutique manufacturing, I've set up a number of workstations that enable us to turn out commercial quality electronic products in a **150** Square foot home based



manufacturing space. We haven't produced anything for the last few years due to supply side shortages, but I was compelled to fire up the "factory" and turn out a few items so I'm going to take you along.

As the Clocks Change: Still No Law for Permanent DST in USA & Canada



Even though **21 states want to make Daylight Saving Time (DST) permanent**, most of the US and Canada will fall back to standard time as planned on **Sunday, November 5, 2023**.

Clocks will be **Set back 1 hour** from 02:00 (2 am) to 01:00 (1 am) local time. Remember, it is **LOCAL** time that changes **NOT UTC!**

The U.S. Air Force Military Auxiliary Radio System (MARS) will be celebrating 75 years of service this November.

There will be a special event starting at 0001Z on November 5, 2023, and it will run through 2359Z on Veterans Day. The event will challenge amateur radio operators to contact as many of the ten Communications Wings as they can. More than 700 MARS stations will be calling CQ in the Technician and General portion of the 160 - 6-meter bands using SSB, CW, and digital modes. Special event call signs will be W1A through W1K, and bonus stations call signs will be K4AF and KE6UEU. QSL cards will not be issued, but a certificate will be available for every contact. Additional information can found at the U.S. Air Force MARS website. U.S. Air Force MARS provides contingency communications support on behalf of all personnel at the U.S.



Department of Defense and other government branches to support national security missions whenever, however, and wherever assistance is required. Air Force MARS Public Information Officer Kenneth Holloway, KA5KEN, said MARS operators have been providing a critical service for decades. "This event symbolizes our respect for the many operators who have worked hard for MARS for many decades," said Holloway. He added that MARS now provides a worldwide 24/7/365 telephone service to US military aircraft via HF radio. More information is available at MARSRADIO.

Below is an interesting item from 27 years ago, provided to us by Gregg/N8GEO. Gregg found it in a pile of "important" papers that he had saved years ago. I was not able to determine the original source of the "LARC Log" [Editor]

Morse Code In Music

While listening to your favorite music, don't be suprised if you hear those strange and annoying sounds of that terrible Morse code!

Case in point, on Joe Walsh's latest solo album "Songs for a Dying Planet" is a song titled "Vote For Me". The song is preceded with Morse code which pounds out "REGISTER AND VOTE FOR ME AR". Brian, KF2HC, states that the same message appears on Joe's first album "Barnstorm" in a song titled "Mother". Joe holds an Advanced class Amateur license.

Another album worth noting is Roger Waters' album "Radio Kaos". This album is filled with Morse messages. Most of the code is underlying the haunting music and very difficult to copy. The album's cover is also worth noting...it is littered with Morse code characters. The album's song titles are all spelled out in Morse Code!

The rock band RUSH has a song title "YYZ" on their album "Moving Pictures". This songs starts out with a heavy percussion belting out "YYZ" and then followed by bass and guitar blaring out the same. Well, the characters YYZ are the beacon identifier for the Toronto International Airport. The inspiration for the song came from Alex Lifeson, the guitarist for the band, who holds a private pilots license.

Carter Bennett, KI5SR, brings to my attention that there is badly formed Morse code on Kate Bush's album "Hounds of Love". Carter informs me that the song "Watching You Without Me" contains the code "SOS". It was also reported that this track has some RTTY going in and out of tune. KI5SR continues with information regarding the album "Saving the Wildlife" by Mannheim Steamroller. He states that there is a track on the album which sounds too much like "CQ" in Morse.

Charlie, N2JQA, brings to my attention that there is Morse Codeon Ronnie Montrose's album (Elektra 1982 EI-60034) "GAMMA 3". The song "Stranger" contains Morse Code which spells "STRANGER".

Wayne, WA6MPG, states that in 1967, the band "PEARLS BEFORE SWINE" recorded a song with an adult-rated CW message in it. The song was titled "MISS MORSE". The song is said to have vulgarities in it spelled out with Morse Code. The album was titled "ONE NATION UNDERGROUND".

Randall, KE0YG, provided the following info about Morse Code in the computer game called "RED STORM RISING" by Microprose. Randall says that in the opening credits there is music which contains Morse Code which spells out "THE RUSSIANS ARE COMING" at about 18 WPM. Randall says that he can confirm this on the C-64

version and he believes that the IBM version plays the CW message in the theme song.

Craig, VK3CRA, informed me of a TV show called "INSPECTOR MORSE". Craig has never seen the show but, from info gathered, states that the inspector's name is never given in the show. It is alleged, however, to be contained in Morse Code which is played as part of the show's introductory music.

Howie, N2WX and Mark, KM6XU, informed me that "Radioactivity" by Kraftwerk has lots of good Morse code in it. Mark also states that the band Missing Persons has a song with some code in it but Mark didn't supply any info on the song.

A message from John, NI6D, brought to my attention pseudo Morse code in the song "Radio Silence" on Thomas Dolby's album titled "The Golden Age of Wireless".

Dave, N0DET, adds that there is code in the song "Planet Claire" by the B-52's. In the intro to "Planet Claire", a kind of Spy vs. Spy mood is created by the music, and plainly audible CW. The Morse code says, "NAKS DE CFH I I ZKR F13395 5156 AS 662,", then fades to music. Dave believes that 'NAKS' and 'CFH' are commercial station callsigns. More information pertaining to the code comes in from Ron, VE3RYN. Ron says that "NAKS" should be "NAWS" which stands for 'North Atlantic Weather Station' and "CFH" is a CDN military ship/shore station located near Halifax, Nova Scotia.

Michael, W9OJ, claims that the words "Love You" are spelled out in morse code at the end of the "Iron Butterfly Theme" by Iron Butterfly. This song is on their first album "Heavy" and is also on the double album titled "Rare Flight".

Ian, VK2IAQ, writes in with information stating that the UK rock band 'Barclay James Harvest' has two songs which contain morse code. Ian states that the song "Nova Lepidoptera", a sci-fi song from the 1977 album "XII", starts off with "UFO" repeated in slow morse code. Also, the title track of the album "Ring of Changes" starts with the title sent twice in morse code. John Lees, the lead guitarist, is a licensed amateur operator in the UK.

Bill, WA6ITF, reports some really good Morse code on the CD "SEEK YOU" by Andrew, G3WZZ, and Lissa Huddleson.

Well, that's about it for now. TNX to all who have provided me with information on this subject and TNX to all who have inquired about the subject. Until next time, KEEP POUNDING BRASS!






