Siren Test Reporting Update:

Dale/K8RO and Marty/K8HVI provided an update on the Macomb Count Siren Testing. Testing has been going well with a focus on the 51 priority locations of which only 11 are remaining to be checked. They had a meeting with the new person that will be managing the sirens for the county. The county plans to update their map and make sure all locations are on it. Marty/K8HVI has created a link to a spreadsheet that will allow members to select a siren to check and others will be able to see that one is taken. The county will focus on fixing the ones we marked as failed and then notify us to recheck that location.

ARRL Liaison report: Keith/W8KD

- ARRL received two HF rigs from Yaesu to use at their location.
- The mobile app is now available for Orlando HamCation.
- QST had an article on leasing a remote station. They can go up to 1500 watts and the cost is \$99.00 a year plus a per minute charge. The per minute charge can be anywhere from \$0.05 to \$0.99 per minute.
- There are 56 contests and 18 special event stations this month.
- There was an ARRL board meeting in January. One topic was changes to Field Day. No details on the changes were provided at this time.
- The ARRL convention which is held every two years will be in Dayton for 2024. The 2026 convention will be held in Huntsville.
- ARRL is planning to do an upgrade to the Logbook of the World. No details were provided.
- ARRL is investigating why a high number of people get an amateur radio license and never get on the air.
- ARRL is trying to promote 10-meter and 6-meter activity during solar cycle 25.
- School Club Round Up is February 13 to the 17. February 18 through the 19 is the International DX/CW contest.
- The ARRL is going to focus on training for emergency services like ICS 300 and 400, CPR and First Aid.

Evening Program: The program was Hints and Tricks presented by members. Many good ideas were presented.

Meeting Close: A motion was made by Mike/N5WCS and second by Dennis/N8MKG Motion passed and meeting was adjourned at 7:57 PM.


February Meeting Tips Addenda

Your Editor has found that in Windows 10 you can go to Settings -> System -> Sound, and then Device Properties for the chosen device and you are presented with a Rename field. No registry editing used.

Several members expressed interest in the specifics about using the tuner connector on Icom HF radios to put the radio into low power tune mode. Here is the IC Tune Schematic:





