

Field Day is Fast Approaching!

ARRL Field Day is right around the corner, and we have set some ambitious goals for this year's event. To achieve them, we need everyone's participation and support. Dale/K8RO will be organizing a Zoom meeting to finalize any remaining details. The date and time for this meeting will be announced on our reflector soon, so stay tuned!



Dayton Hamvention Recap

The Dayton Hamvention was, as always, a fantastic experience. I didn't go with any major purchases in mind, but I did pick up some cables and connectors. My main focus was on attending the forums. Here are a few highlights:

- "How to Grow an Amateur Radio Club from Nearly Dead to Amazing" Hosted by the Lake Cumberland Amateur Radio Association (LCARA), this forum provided insights on revitalizing amateur radio clubs. With nearly 100 members, LCARA shared strategies that we already implement about 90% of. They suggested having a major annual project to involve everyone (like building a communications trailer) and creating an online presence through streaming videos produced by the club. These are ideas we might consider for future growth.
- "Kit Building Techniques for Success" This forum offered a basic introduction to kit building. While it didn't present much new information, it was a good refresher on the fundamentals.
- "YL Forum" Attending with my XYL, Cheryl (N8MKF), who is a member of the Young Ladies Radio League (YLRL), we learned about handling pileups, YL-specific contests, and the history (started in 1939), and activities of the YLRL, including their upcoming convention in Utah. It was an engaging session, even from a guy's perspective.
- "The Youth Forum" This forum covered exciting topics like Fun with POTA (Perfect Opportunity for Adventure - their acronym not mine), 4H Clubs for Ham Radio, school club licensing, and amateur satellites. The

"AMSAT" This session discussed current and upcoming satellite missions and the development of new satellites. While some of the technical details were complex, it was fascinating to hear about the future of amateur satellite communications. [https://www.amsat.org/]

L'Anse Creuse ARC Fox Hunt Process / Rules

We have a few new members in the club who have never participated in one of our hidden transmitter (Fox) hunts. Other members have questions on the details. I thought it would be informative to publish the general "rules" for conducting the hunt that the club has followed for many years. If I've missed anything important or made any errors, I'm sure one of my many fact checkers will set me straight! 73, John/N8FYL



This is an informal codification of the process used for the L'Anse Creuse Hidden Transmitter (Fox) Hunt.

The hunt will be conducted on 2-meter FM simplex. The frequency will be determined at the time of the hunt.

There will be two classes: Doppler equipped, and non-Doppler equipped.

The starting location is the site of our meeting. (Tucker Senior Center as of 2023).

The post-hunt rendezvous location (which may be a site with food and beverages) will be announced before and/or during the hunt.

The fox will be ready to begin transmitting within 15 minutes of the end of the membership meeting.

The Fox may use a "fox box" which automatically generates a signal on a periodic basis OR will transmit by voice on a regular basis.

The fox will be located anywhere within a 5-mile radius of the starting point that is reachable on foot. (NO hiding a fox in a boat on Lake St. Clair!)

The Fox will be in an area generally accessible to the public.

A "find" is defined as locating the source of the transmitted RF. You may spot the vehicle the operators of the fox are in, but that is not necessarily the source of the RF. The fox box may (most likely will) be hidden but observable by the operator(s).

The hunt will end when one of the following occurs:

- All the teams have located the fox.
- Some teams have located the fox and the remainder have reported to the fox operator that they
 are giving up and heading to the finish rendezvous.
- A pre-determined time (elapsed or time of day) is reached.

The Fox operator will keep a list of the hunting teams and will record the time each team locates the fox.

The results will be shared with the hunters at the post-hunt rendezvous. In an ideal scenario, the Fox will write an article for *The Tuned Circuit* reporting the results. At a minimum, the results should be provided to *The Tuned Circuit* editor.

There are no prizes, only bragging rights, and personal satisfaction.

Club tradition is that the winner of this year's hunt will be the fox for the next hunt. The tradition is open to negotiation, and anyone can volunteer to be a fox.




