[HamSCI](#) Solar Eclipse QSO Party (SEQP) begins on Monday, April 8 at 1400 UTC and concludes at 2400 UTC [that will be 10:00 AM to 8:00 PM local time here in the US Eastern time zone]



The purpose of the SEQP is to generate propagation observations using [Reverse Beacon Network](#) (RBN) and [PSK Reporter](#) on the amateur bands before, during, and after the eclipse. The event is unique among ham radio competitions as it awards points for two-way contacts and also awards bonus points for reception reports from skimmers, RBN nodes, and the like. [HamSCI](#) has announced the results from the inaugural running of the [Gladstone Signal Spotting Challenge](#). Held during the October 14, 2023, North American annular solar eclipse, the challenge was designed to recognize operators of digital mode stations who contribute valuable data to ionospheric research. Receiving stations uploaded their records to sites such as [PSKreporter.info](#), [WSPRnet.org](#), and [reversebeacon.net](#). Transmitting stations were received by stations worldwide who uploaded their results to the same databases, creating records of the transmitting stations' activities. Here is the [link to the full results](#), including participant scores and a sampling of station design details and station photographs. The next event will be held on April 8, 2024, during the North American total solar eclipse.



This is the same place we stayed last year. The procedure is **ALMOST** exactly the same as last year. There are a lot of restaurants close by. The hotel website is: <https://www.ihg.com/holidayinnexpress/hotels/us/en/dayton/dayml/hoteldetail>

Here’s the deal: I have completed a “group sales agreement” with the facility. It is UP TO YOU to call and confirm a room with the hotel. They will take a room from the reservation block and put it in your name and take your payment info at that time. **YOU** are responsible to call and cancel the room should you need to. Once the room is pulled from the block it is all on you.

NEW this year you can either call or book online.

IF CALLING TO MAKE YOUR RESERVATION:

When you call there be certain to press 0 (Talk to the front desk). Do not choose option 1 (make a reservation) because you will end up talking to someone in a foreign county who will have NO clue what you are requesting. PLEASE follow these instructions! If you don’t I will NOT get accurate info from the hotel, and you’re making an issue for me. Thank you for your cooperation.

Give the person at the front desk the dates you want to stay and mention that it’s from a block of rooms “Bak Hamvention 2024”.

TO BOOK ONLINE:

- Go to the official webpage shown above.
- Select “book now” and enter the dates of your stay.
- Under Rate preferences select “Group Rate” and enter rate code BAK
- Then search for your room and select which type of room and complete the transaction.

You have until Monday April 15 to book a room. Don’t wait for the last day. If you had a room in a prior year you have priority. You don’t need to have attended before to book a room, it’s open to all LCARC members. Simply book the nights that you need. You are NOT responsible for all 3 days if you don’t choose that. Note the types of rooms. Rates are plus tax.

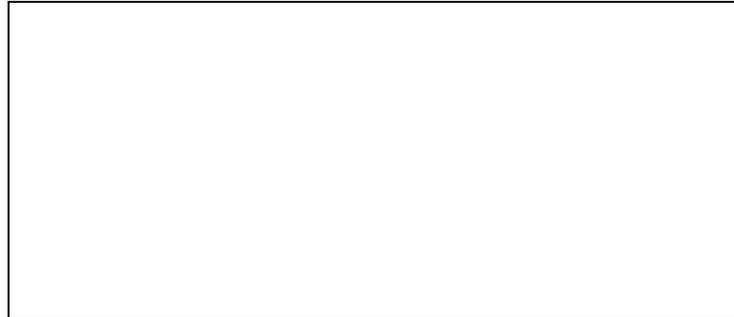

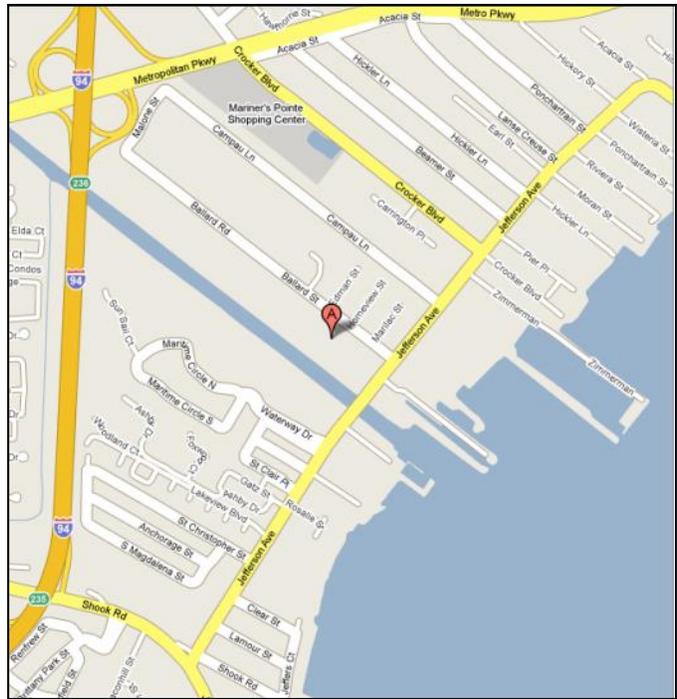
