April Digital Challenge - Olivia: In the month ahead, we're delving into the realm of "Olivia." If you're already familiar with PSK or RTTY, you're primed to explore Olivia. Olivia stands out as a robust, multi-frequency shift keying digital mode specifically crafted to excel in low signal-to-noise ratio environments and cope with multipath propagation challenges. Remarkably, Olivia can reliably decode signals even with a signal-to-noise ratio as low as -14dB.

Although not as widely known as FT8, Olivia has consistently surprised me with its active community and engaging QSOs whenever I've sought them out. Notably, some signals that fall below the noise floor might not register on a waterfall display. Therefore, it's crucial to activate RSID (Reed Solomon ID) to ensure signal detection. Furthermore, Olivia boasts error correction capabilities, ensuring that what you send is precisely what they receive.

A Fun Way to Support Radio Science

The 2024 Solar Eclipse is almost here. It is expected to be about 98% of totality in our area of Michigan. The partial phase begins at 1:58 PM on Monday, April 8. Mid-eclipse is at 3:14 PM. The eclipse of 2024 will end at 4:27 PM.



<u>HamSCI</u> Solar Eclipse QSO Party (SEQP) begins on **Monday**, April 8 at 1400 UTC and concludes at 2400 UTC [that will be 10:00 AM to 8:00 PM local time here in the US Eastern time zone]

The purpose of the SEQP is to generate propagation observations using <u>Reverse Beacon Network</u> (RBN) and <u>PSK Reporter</u> on the amateur bands before, during, and after the eclipse. The event is unique among ham radio competitions as it awards points for two-way contacts and also awards bonus points for reception reports from skimmers, RBN nodes, and the like. I was just listening to the 160 meter AM net from 4 land.

https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=pxkkJXSCoB4. Fun stuff with ancient gear.

I remember W80HS, Morrie, who built a little four-tube transmitter that was very popular. The receiver was an AM car radio with the trimmer capacitor screwed all the way down, so that at the very edge of the band, it could hear 1806 KC.

Most of the guys from SEMARA had commercial center-loaded verticals on their cars, but my neighbor, WA8CDX, Dick Blind had a center coil wound on an old Clorox bottle. That was the state of the art in the poor part of town just south of Detroit City Airport.

They didn't have a lot of money, but they sure did have a lot of fun.

I noticed that we have a 10 meter net. Back in March of 1958, with the highest sunspots on record, one of my neighbors, Otto Wentzel, W8BSG made quite a name for himself on 10 meters: He was fond of AM Super-modulation with negative peak clipping. Thus he was not only on 10 Meters, but 9 Meters, 11 Meters and TV Channels 2 and 3 on his harmonics. It is amazing that he didn't come home from work at the Chrysler plant where he was an electrician to find a noose tied in his coax.

As seen in the March 2024 AARP Bulletin


April Fools' Day dates back over 400 years; it's even older than Thanksgiving (true! No joke!). Which means there have been lots of chances for good mischief.




