


Membership Report

The 25th anniversary of Route 66 On the Air will have a new twist this year...a California rover.



W6V, manned by Annie Lewis, N6ACL, and John Litz, NZ6Q, will be driving the route from Santa Monica, California to Chicago, Illinois, activating historic sites, points of interest and blogging the adventure. They will operate on SSB, FT8 and CW from stop to stop, multi-op single transmitter, and both will be on the air when they stop for the evening. The idea of doing a "start-to-finish" Route 66 rover from one end to the other started several years ago with the help of their friend Dan Reid, KB6UNC, now SK. The event, from 0001Z September 7 - 2359Z September 15, is sponsored by the [Citrus Belt Amateur Radio Club](#) and the [Barstow Amateur Radio Club](#). It celebrates the "Mother Road," U.S.

Highway 66, which was established in 1926 and was the first major roadway improvement to link the West Coast with the nation's heartland. There will be 23 (1x1) special event stations along the route from Santa Monica to Chicago. In 2023, there were 77 such stations, making a total of 623 contacts during the 9-day event.

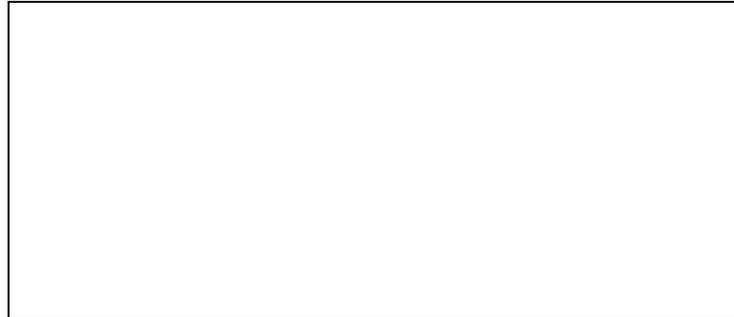


