
Membership Report



He's doing better currently, and now conducting himself properly.


CHASING DX COUNTRIES


I first started ham radio in the Philippines in 1978 with the guidance of my dad (DU9RJ) and became DV8HR (general class).

I returned to ham radio in March 2019. My interest ignited again when I was doing a usual road test for my job, and I passed by a house with a triband antenna. I approached the owner of the house and started asking questions. It turned out to be Dale (K8RO), now my Elmer. After this conversation, I bought my equipment and passed my technician and general tests on the same day and eventually became an Extra class licensee.

Now after almost 6 years of SSB & FT/8 operating I am sitting on



contacts with 252 countries in my logbook. 227 contacts are confirmed to my DXCC account through ARRL's <u>Logbook of The World</u>. I also have confirmation for WAS (Worked All States), and 39 of the 40 CQ zones. I'm still chasing ATNOs [All Time New Ones] DX countries or entities.


