Report: AST/Art-Science's Bid for the 70 cm Band

Recently, **AST & Science, LLC** (sometimes referred to as "Art-Science") submitted a proposal to the FCC seeking authorization to use **430–440 MHz**—which overlaps with the 70 cm amateur band—for satellite telemetry, tracking, and command (TT&C) operations for a planned constellation of **248 satellites** communicating with five ground stations using up to five channels of 256 kHz bandwidth.

ARRL quickly stepped in, filing formal opposition on **July 22, 2025**, arguing that:

- The **430–440 MHz band** isn't allocated for these commercial satellite operations.
- AST failed to justify why they need TT&C spectrum beyond what's already available.
- Their current five-satellite system already appears to transmit in this band across the globe—not just near permitted ground stations—raising concerns about harmful interference.

This includes interference risk to emergency communications and amateur satellite operations in the **435–438 MHz sub-band**.

The ARRL, the RSGB, several national bodies, and **over 3,000 individual**

operators submitted comments opposing the proposal as part of FCC Proceeding 25-201. This collective push demonstrates the strength of organized advocacy—and frankly, **if you're not already a member of ARRL, this is a prime example why membership matters.** Their swift advocacy helps protect our spectrum and ensures amateur radio's ongoing viability and integrity.

June 4th Fox Hunt Recap

It is often said that history is written by the winners, and in this case, it is true!

2025 June 4 Fox Ken/N8KC operated solo with the K8AJJ Fox Box. Ken “hid” himself behind the **Wash & Shine, Self Serve & Touchless Automatic** car wash at 260 N River Rd, [42.595487414774354](tel:42595487414774354), - [82.86204259779002](tel:8286204259779002).

The fox signal was weak at the Tucker Senior Center. We (John/N8FYL, Denny/AC8JH, and Mike/N8VDZ) left the start at 20:18 with an odometer reading 32374. We headed NW on Crocker Blvd in the general direction of the signal. By the time we reached the intersection of Lawndale the direction was definitely off to our right and getting stronger. Attempting to drive straight toward our strongest reading we went right on Dickinson St then left on Dickinson Pl only to encounter a dead end blocking our path to S River Rd. Reversed course, went right (northwesterly) on Dickinson Pl, back onto Dickinson St. By the time we reached Michigan St the signal was to our right, so we proceeded east on Michigan St only to come to the tee at Michigan St and Avery St. With the path to the left marked “Dead End” we could only turn right (south). Stopping near the Avery St, Rathbone St/South River Rd intersection our signal strength still indicated an easterly direction, so we proceeded left (easterly) on South River Rd. By the time we passed under I-94 the signal direction was clearly on the other (north) side of the Clinton River!

We turned around in the parking lot of the Eagles lodge and made our way back to Dickinson St, across the river, onto Northbound Gratiot to go easterly on N River Rd. The signal strength was getting stronger and stronger as we proceeded and as we rounded the curve our antenna reading lead us to spot the fox behind the car wash. We checked in with Ken/N8KC at 20:43 (25 minutes elapsed). The odometer read 32381 for a mileage of 7 miles. Ken informed us that we were the first team to check in! Another win for Team N8FYL.

Other Teams – all DNFF (Did Not Find the Fox):

Tim/AD8DL, Tyler/KE8WFY, Ananra/KF8DCK. Per N8KC: Tim & Kids showed me a map of his bearings plots. At least two of his bearings from four separate plots crossed right where the fox was hidden, but Tim had a lot of trouble copying the fox on his Yagi. At his closest, he was about 3/4 mile away and had been relying on the strength of the signal on his omnidirectional mobile antenna.

Hunting concluded at 21:25.

The post hunt gather was again at Bentley’s Roadhouse on S. River Road. Ken/KD8RJN, Fritz/KE8BFW, Doug/N8PYN, Garry/KD8JM, Marty/K8HVI, Debbie/KC8WH and Jenny were present to greet/welcome the hunters as they arrived to enjoy the post hunt pizza and beer.

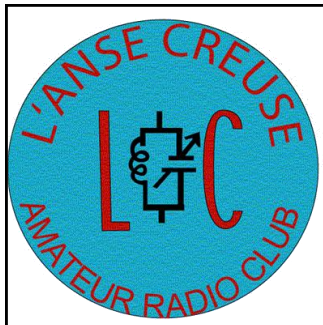
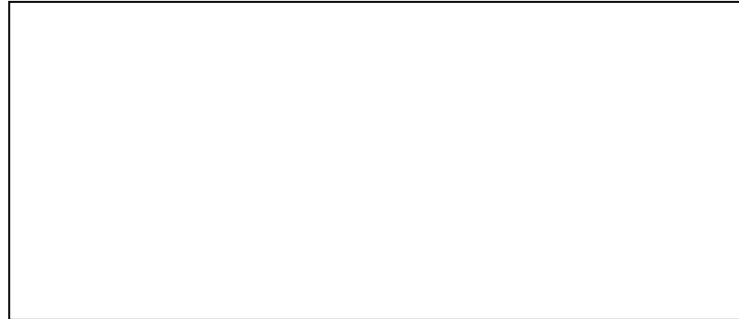

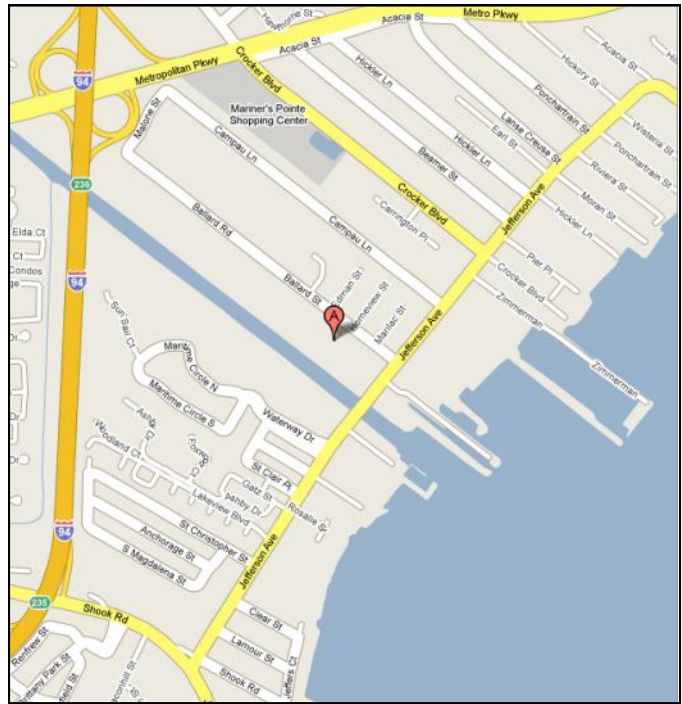
