Wow time goes by fast! I am writing this after catching up on my lack of sleep from a great time at the club's Winter Field Day event (I only got about an hour sleep all weekend). I think that WFD was a great success. Even though the weather was very cold I think we had a good turnout.

We successfully used our new Duplexer/Multiplexers/Band Filters stuff that the club just purchased. We put up just one TFD (terminated folded dipole) antenna. We then ran 5 stations on 5 different bands all at the same time. We worked 6 different bands, and on 5 of them we made contact on all three modes (phone, digital, and CW). Marty/K8HVI set up his satellite station, and we succeeded in making contacts on both an FM satellite (ISS) and a linear SSB satellite (RS-44).

Since we didn't have a sign up sheet, we are not sure how many people actually showed up, but we did have 14 actual operators, that together made 298 contacts. So all in all, I sure enjoyed it, and I think everyone else did too.

Coming up the week of February 18 - February 24, ARRL members have a opportunity to operate as W1AW/8. December Meeting Minutes: Dale/K8RO asked for a motion to approve the December 2025 meeting minutes as posted in *The Tuned Circuit*. A motion to approve was made by Marty/K8HVI and seconded by Keith/W8KD. The motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: Gregg/N8GEO;

Total amount in the account is	\$20013.12
The Youth Fund has	\$2373.73
Total available (unallocated) is	\$15909.89

Editor says: the \$1730.00 discrepancy is related to the funds sent to the Knights of Columbus that is later returned to us.

A motion to approve the Treasurer's report was made by Mike/N5WCS and seconded by Marty/K8HVI. The motion passed.

Swaps: The Livonia swap is coming up SATURDAY, February 21, 2026.

Technical Committee Report: Dale/K8RO said the technical group had a meeting today (1/07/2026) to try out the multiplexers and antenna setup for Winter Field Day. We tried using three radios and Marty's terminated folded dipole antenna. Everything seemed to function normally with no interference between the radios using different bands and 100 watts of power. Dale said the technical group will meet twice a month to work on documentation of the repeater equipment and determine why the Wires-X is not working right now. It may be an internet connection problem.

ARRL Report: Hal/W8HJP said the technician license test question pool will be changing this summer.

ARRL says this is the year of the club.

They are having a coding competition this year for youth amateur radio enthusiasts.

Also the ARRL newsletter states they will have a "**worked all states**" contest on any mode. Check out the ARRL newsletter for more information. This contest starts today, 1/7/2026.

QSL Report: Dale/K8RO reported that he logged 12 QSO's this month, some dating back to 2004.

Membership Report: John/N8FYL, we have 105 members of which 4 are life members and 15 are getting the first-year free membership. 21 people have not renewed yet.

Tuned Circuit: John/N8FYL The deadline for next TC newsletter is January 26, 2026.

Old business: Last year the LCARC club sponsored a plaque for the Michigan QSO Party and has received a request to sponsor it again. The cost will be \$75.00. A motion was made by Ken/N8KC and seconded by Dennis/N8MKG to sponsor it again. The motion passed. We received a thank you card from "Mike/AC8ER SK" wife about helping selling Mike's equipment. Gregg/N8GEO still had some equipment for sale. Ted/K8EO will take the rest of the equipment to Dayton this year.

Siren Testing Update: Marty/K8HVI provided an update on the Macomb County Siren Testing. Marty reported that 16 sirens were tested and all went off on time and worked well. The reporting data sheet worked well, and he explained how the web site siren map is set up and working. The next siren test will be on February 7, 2026. The new sirens to be tested are listed on the website. You can sign up there to help.

Swap Report: Russ/N8HAR thanked everyone for helping with the swap. He said the club took in \$6455.00 in total and that expenses were \$3409.18, for a profit of \$3045.83. We sold 64 tables and 250 people attended the swap. The cafeteria made \$239.00, the radio raffle profit was \$864.00, and we sold the Flex 5000 radio (from the N8AT estate) for \$500.00. It's likely the 2026 swap will be on December 6, 2026, but is not confirmed yet. *Well done, Russ!*

Board Meeting: The board meeting this month will be on January 21, 2026, via Zoom at 7:30pm.

VE Testing: Gregg/N8GEO said the VE testing this month will be on January 19, 2026. 4 people have already signed up to take tests this month, and Gregg is looking for help. They had 5 people take tests at the swap. They had a good team, and everything went well. Thanks to the VE helpers!

Monthly Dinner out: The monthly dinner out will be on January 28 at 6:00pm and is at **Buddy's Pizzeria** on Hayes Road north of Hall Road. Please email Gregg by noon on Monday before the dinner out evening with how many people will be coming.

This year's Board member elections: Dale/K8RO as President, Rick/K8RWM as VP and President-Elect, Gregg/N8GEO as Treasurer, Dennis/AC8JH as Secretary. Continuing appointments: Doug/N8PYN as Technical Officer, Dale/K8RO as Assistant Technical officer, Hal/W8HJP as ARRL Liaison. Dale/K8RO asked for a motion to approve the officers as stated above. The motion was made by Dennis/N8MKG and seconded by Lito/K8AJJ. The motion passed.

New Business: Rick/K8RWM; said Winter Field Day is coming up January 24-25. The transmitting starts at 11:00 AM on Saturday (instead of 1 PM as in prior years), until 4 pm Sunday. Winter Field Day will be held at the Tucker Senior Center. Prior to setting up, some will meet for breakfast at **Great Lakes Restaurant** on Harper south of Metro Parkway. Winter Field Day will be a lot of fun, and we welcome everyone to come out and visit or bring and run a station. Every station will stay on a single band the whole time and should be able to run all 3 modes including SSB, CW and digital.

Meeting Held on Zoom: President Dale/K8RO called the January 21st, 2026, LCARC board meeting to order at approximately 7:28 PM

Winter Field Day: We discussed the generator, cables, radio equipment, food and anything we will need for the day. We talked about buying RG8X for outside between the mux and antenna for next year.

February monthly program: Dale asked about the program for next month's meeting. Rick discussed talking about interfacing radios to computers. YouTube has lots of information and Dale has a video we may use.

We need to understand what it takes to get our own license to raffle an item worth more than \$600.00. Russ/N8HAR said that he would be willing to join the Knights of Columbus if Gregg does not. Rick/K8RWM suggested that maybe we should talk with an accountant or the ARRL about our status as a club for any income the club has. Rick volunteered to contact ARRL and ask if they can help us.

Gregg got a letter from the insurance agency saying that they want to cancel our liability insurance. He is looking into it.

Gregg said he paid for the plaque sponsorship for the Michigan QSO party.

Gregg also asked if it was ok that the club donates \$100 to both the Knights of Columbus and the Tucker Senior Center. The vote passed unanimously.

VE Testing: Gregg/N8GEO. VE testing went very smoothly on January 19. 10 people took their tests resulting in 8 techs, 1 general and 1 extra class upgrade. The testing went well.

Recruiting W1AW/8 Operators for February 18-24

From Michigan ARRL Section email dated 01/22/2026 19:36

Did you know that the ARRL is holding a Year-Long Worked All States (WAS-250) operating event to recognize the 250th Anniversary (Semiquincentennial) of the US Declaration of Independence? <https://www.arrl.org/america250-was> Have you been working ARRL America250 stations? Did you contact Nebraska and/or New York last week? How about Louisiana, South Carolina, and/or West Virginia this week? Are you chasing WAS or Triple Play? How would you like a respite and switch from chaser to chased?

For seven days in February, (Wednesday February 18 at 00:00 UTC to Tuesday February 24 at 23:59 UTC,) ARRL Michigan Section operators will be putting W1AW/8 on the air! The goal of this operation is to activate as many bands (excluding 60 Meters) as possible on the three modes of CW, Phone and Digital, plus satellite. Interested in being a W1AW/8 operator? The requirements are straightforward:

- ◆ The operator **must** be an ARRL Michigan Section member.
- ◆ The operator's transmitter and antenna must physically reside within the state of Michigan. Notice to snowbirds and other travelers: if you can control a Michigan based transmitter per FCC regulations, you're welcome to participate as well. In other words, as W1AW/8 you can send Hellschreiber from your chaise lounge on Miami Beach!
- ◆ The operator is expected to observe all FCC regulations, including only operating on frequencies/modes allocated to their license class and at permitted power levels.
- ◆ All logging must be submitted in ADIF format.
- ◆ Get on the air, make contacts, and have fun!

Notice that there's no requirement for station hardware or experience. So yes, while we want all the mega-transmitter/multi-antenna/multi-thousand hour experienced operators we can get, we also encourage relatively new operators with 100 watts and a wire to apply. We can shepherd/shelter you with appropriate band and time slot suggestions to keep you from getting into the pileup deep end. In return you get to gently develop your pileup handling skills.

Still interested? If so, please e-mail me (fschebor@arrl.net) with your:

- ◆ Name and call as it appears on your FCC license.
- ◆ Your class of FCC license.
- ◆ Your QTH address and maidenhead grid ID.
- ◆ Your phone number (would only be used in an emergency).
- ◆ Your e-mail address (if different from the address you're responding from).
- ◆ A couple of sentences that describe your capabilities and experience – saves me from reading all the QRZ bios

If your schedule won't permit the February event, you're not out of luck. The February event is the first of two. The second event will be seven days starting October 28 thru November 3. A call for that event will be made in July/August.

Lastly, I was a member of the 2014 ARRL Centennial W1AW/8 operators. Our group had a blast! Please consider joining us!

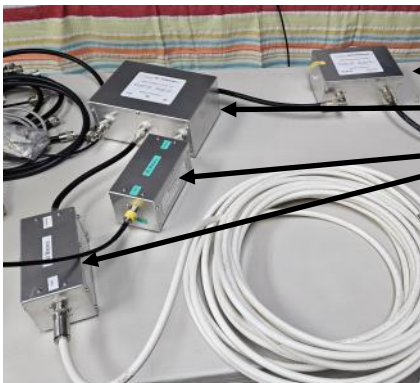

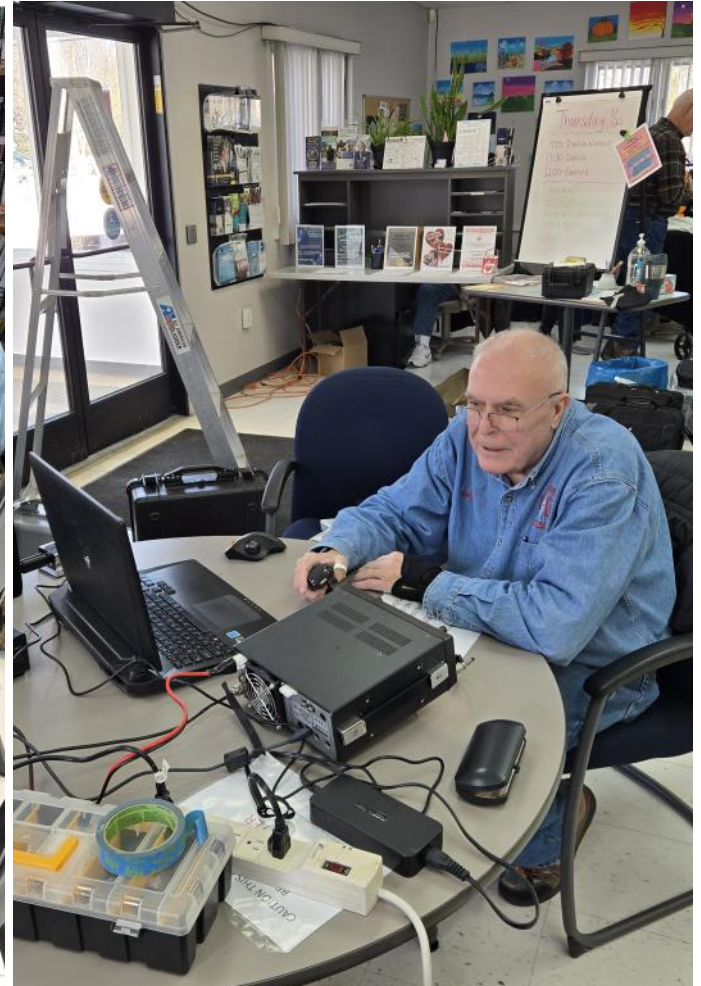

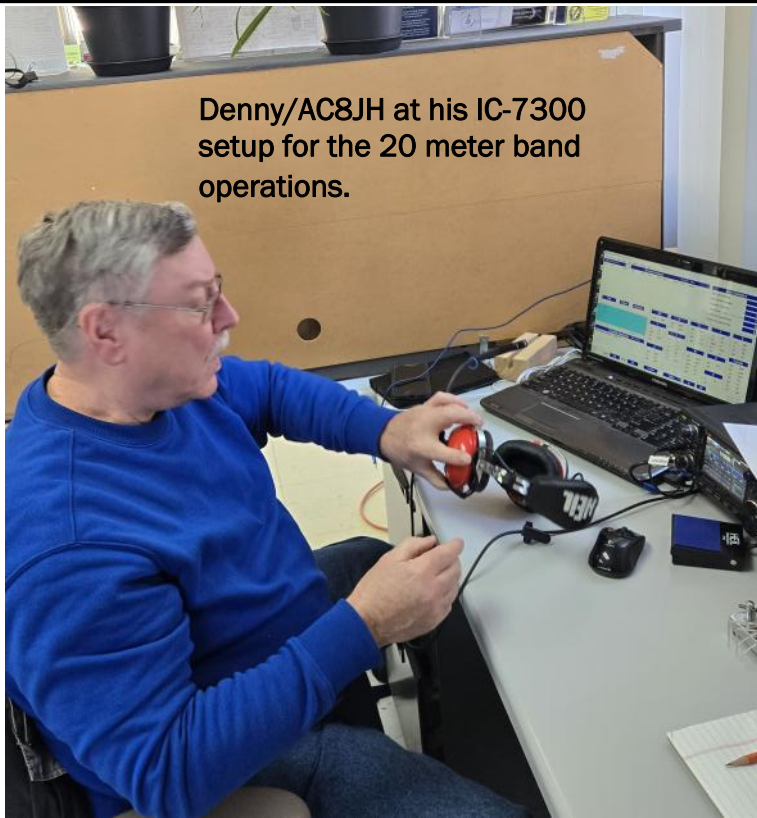

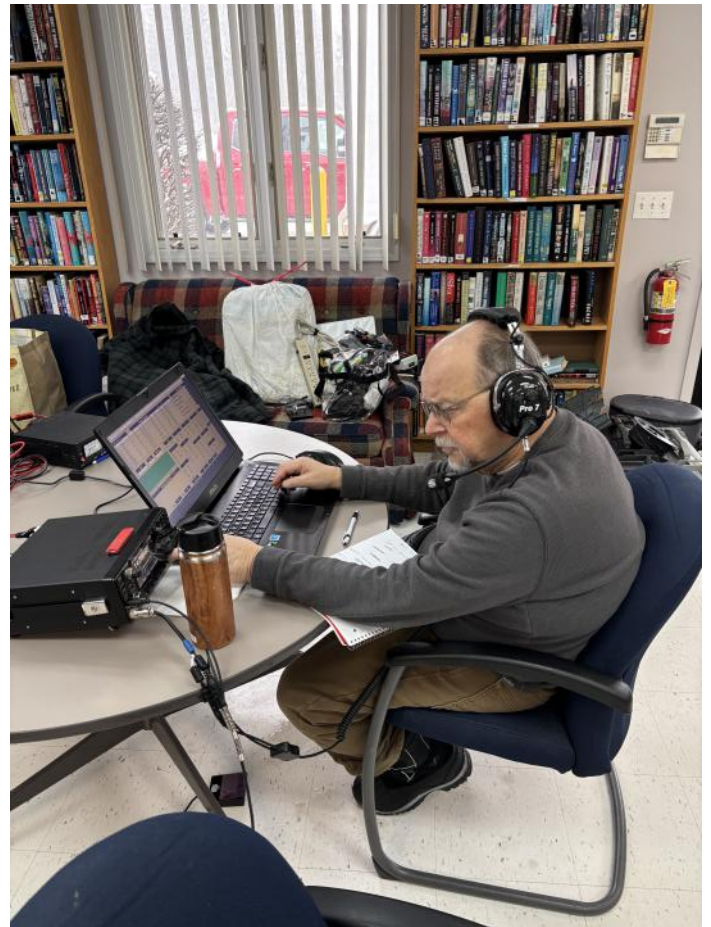
