

### **AARC** community service: Huge in May!

The AARC supported three major community service projects in May. Approximately 17 members provided well over 200 person-hours of volunteer work to Marlborough and surrounding towns as cited below:

### Hazmat Day - Marlborough

Nine MEMA members provided communication and traffic support for Marlborough's hazardous waste collection day. It was cold and rainy but over 110 carloads of hazardous waste were collected at the Easterly Wastewater Treatment Facility. Don Cusson distributed "Emergency Service" fluorescent vests for MEMA members and we had plenty of opportunity to test the new collapsible weather canopy.

#### **School Watch**

This season's school watch winds down early in June. Fortunately, there have been no major incidents to report at this time. Ed Fitzgerald organized this year's watch and relays his thanks to all who participated. In all, 11 members volunteered, providing over 136 person-hours of coverage for the community.

# AARC members establish radio coverage map for the Marlborough Hospital

Club volunteers and MEMA members surveyed conditions in ten local towns to help identify dead zones for communication with the emergency amateur radio station in Marlborough Hospital. Participants tested simplex and local repeater frequencies in the 2m and 70cm bands at several key locations in each town. The data collected will help generate a coverage and support plan for towns served by the hospital. It will also provide alerts to volunteers should they be deployed to an area with poor radio coverage. Thanks go to Don Cusson and Eric Williams for providing the groundwork and co-ordination. The survey was efficiently completed in two evenings. Thanks also to Charlie & Ruth Ann Regan, Ann Weldon, Quin Spear, Dick Mahoney, Ed Fitzgerald, Frank McInnis, George Pendergast, Jen O'Rourke and Ron Wood for providing their time and vehicles for the mapping. If additional areas need to be tested, requests for volunteers will be made on the AARC email list.
