Museum Musings—The Spirit of '76

Well, maybe not museum but old newsletters and such. As the club was arranging for permanent, central storage space, Ann, KA1PON, said that she had "lots of old club records." I volunteered to review, purge, organize, and archive them.

The first step was to read through old copies of the club newsletter. It was a way to kill a few cold evenings in March.

Our newsletter was originally "QRZ, The Monthly Bulletin of the Algonquin Amateur Radio Club." Volume 1, Issue 1 was April 1976. Subsequent publication apparently skipped July (and December?). Over the years the newsletter has run two (occasionally one) to eight pages. The name "QRZ" lasted through at least 1992; that's the extent of the "lots of old club records" that I "inherited."

From Issue 1: "The second meeting of the newly-organized Amateur Radio Club was conducted on 24 March 1976, in St Mary's school, Broad St, Marlboro. You may wonder why the club remains unnamed. Very simple, we've had several considered: Marlboro AR Club, Middlesex AR Club, and Highland City Club. Those who have attended the last meetings strongly feel that we should wait until the membership is increased and they can select a name representative of all towns surrounding Marlboro—a very reasonable approach. So for the time being your club will remain unnamed." (The name "Algonquin" was adopted before the 2 May issue, but the newsletter was immediately named the QRZ in April.)

The 1976 through 1992 issues that I've reviewed so far were pretty much pre-computer as we know it: typed and reproduced. In the oldest of the old days they were in all-uppercase, too. (Was it a Commodore or a TRS-80?) And remember mimeograph? And postage stamps?

Topics:

- Repeaters, early space station stuff, dinner dances (yes, dinner dances)
- Chasing after delinquent dues
- Heavy DX emphasis
- News: FCC, births, local contester results. And lots of non-news
- Inserts of lists, QST articles, operating aids, repeater lists
- Technical quizzes

Things I learned:

- There was a prior KA1OS in the club.
- For a long while there was a Club net on HF (sometimes 21MHz, sometimes 3.5MHz).
- Flea market came and went, and came, and...

Throughout the years, there were irregular presentations at meetings, but at least once there was a move to limit

business meetings to one hour to allow for speaker time. Some things never change.

History is interesting and informative. Now I'll head on to some other records. There are some newspaper clippings, correspondence of affiliation, and municipal proclamations. Everything will be eventually recorded on a CD-ROM and only the most valuable retained as hardcopy artifacts.
