Andy Stewart (KB1OIQ) will give a talk about "Andy's Ham Radio Linux" at the April meeting.

This is a Linux based software collection that is based on Ubuntu Linux. Andy has been distributing this software collection since 2011 with over 100,000 downloads to date. The talk will be a high level overview of the many different pieces of ham radio software that are included. No Linux expertise is required to enjoy the talk.

Andy holds an Amateur Extra license and has been a ham since 2007. By day, Andy is a digital logic verification engineer. By night, he can be found fixing antique radios, working on "Andy's Ham Radio Linux", building a kit, or participating in a casual ragchew on the air.
