On December 30th, the FCC published a report and order indicating they have lowered the proposed amateur radio license fee from \$50 to \$35. The fee is not implemented yet. If your license expires soon, remember that licenses can be renewed as early as 90 days before expiration to stay ahead of the fee.

Choice of Words

Remember those questions on the license exam about RF exposure? We should all be conversant in the subject, right? We all glibly talk about "radiators," etc. But the general public doesn't speak "ham," or "engineering," or "physics." "Radiation," to them is just another scary word—and our hobby just might endanger them with our radiation, right?

Wrong! Yes, everything radiates but there's ionizing and non-ionizing radiation. RF just doesn't have enough energy to be ionizing radiation. And that 100-watt rig I use doesn't put out any more energy into my neighbor's yard than a 100-watt light bulb would. That's why I stick with "send," "talk to," "transmit," and occasionally "broadcast" (although that term isn't really appropriate to ham radio) when I'm speaking with people.

Here's an e-mail I recently received from a friend over in Harvard, MA. The video he cites goes a bit beyond our immediate needs, but it is interesting and RF exposure shows up at about 5:30 in the video. Plus, it'll give you some background ideas to use in your next conversation with your neighbors.
