Our March speaker is Brian Gudzevich, WO1VES, also known as "Wolf". He has been self-employed since 2008 and is known as a Technology Specialist.

He has several repeaters in operation or part of his Wolf Pack Net in Stoneham, 443.200 (D-Star, YSF, FM) and 147.075 (YSF, FM), Gloucester, 443.700 (YSF, FM), Pepperell, 446.525 (YSF, FM), Goffstown, 444.200 (YSF, FM) and Derry, 446.375 (YSF, FM) known as the Wolf Pack Repeater System.

He is exceptionally knowledgeable with digital amateur radio, including DMR, C4FM (Yeasu Fusion), D-STAR and hotspots.
