A director's meeting of SCCARA was held 19 January, 1948 at the Oyster Loaf Cafe, San Jose. A quorum of directors was present, made up of Directors Barnes and Clayton, President Stevens, and Vice-President Klein. Ex-officio members present were Secretary Johnson and Treasurer Leigh. Emergency Coordinator Barrett was also present.

Voted: That SCCARA distribute locally a hamsheet similar to that circulated by the Detroit Club, containing new circuits, swap information, and general news items and other information of interest. Director Barnes was appointed a committee of one to solicit the cooperation of Frank Quement in the preparation of the sheet. Mr. Barrett was appointed as editor and offerred the assistance of Mr. Ted Lindner.

Voted: That a constitutional amendment be prepared for submission to the membership at the last meeting of February to have one instead of two meetings per month, that to be on the second Monday.

Voted: That a constitutional amendment be prepared for submission to the membership at the last meeting of February to allow, on approval of the Board of Directors, reinstatement of former members me at least or more than one year in arrears upon payment of one year in advance of the reinstatement date, without the necessity for paying back dues, such courtesy to be expended but once per member, and to be accompanied by the payment of a \$1.00 fine. Special provisions to be allowed for members moving from town and subsequently returning.

Voted: To delay formal action on Pacific Division Convention request pending further study and discussion among the board and the membership.

Voted: To reinstate Mr. Ted Lindner as an active member at the usual rate in exchange for his services as an assistant to Mr. Barrett in the preparation of the Hamsheet. This action in response to a letter from Mr. Lindner requesting reinstatement.

Suggested: That a hamfest be planned for Willis Clayton's Coyote ranch in the spring. Proposed for discussion among the membership.

Suggested: That the services of a caterer and the Willow Glen American Legion Hall be obtained for future dinner meetings. President Stevens advised that this would be considerably more economical than present dinner arrangements.

Voted: That Mr. Stevens prepare and submit a detailed report on this subject giving the proposed menus, serving and dishwashing arrangements, costs, etc., for further action.

A report on Red Cross Emergency arrangements, including copies of letters pertaining to procurement of surplus equipment, was heard from Mr. Barrett. Progress appeared to be normal.

The meeting was adjourned at 9 pm.

The meeting was called to order at 8 pm by President Stevens at 43 South Third Street. The minutes of the previous meeting were read, followed by some communications, including the announcement of the 1948 National ARRL Convention and a letter from W2DNE representing the Society of American Radio Amateurs relative to the ARRL Phone Sub Band poll.

Considerable discussion as to the relative merits and demerits of the ARRL Phone proposal then ensued.

It was announced that the next meeting would bring two constitutional amendments before the membership. Everyone was urged to be present.

Various committee reports were heard. The speakers committee announced that it might be some little time before the talk on SSSC could be arranged, due to previous booking, but that it would eventually be heard.

Authorference committee was appointed: wowco, wo TTE, wo AVJ.

There being no new or old business, the meeting was adjourned, and followed by an excellent film presented by the Army recruiting service on the Battle of Britain, and another on Universal Military Training. The usual raffle was then held.

Amendments to the By-Laws of the SANTA CLARA COUNTY AMATEUR RADIO ASSOCIATION To be Presented to the Membership 23 February, 1948

Amendment No. 1

Article III, Section 1, is hereby amended by deleting the words "and fourth" and the plural of "Mondays", to read as follows (deleted words in parenthesis):

Article III

Section 1. Meetings shall be held on the second (and fourth) Monday(s) of each month,

Amendment No. 2

Article V is hereby amended by the addition of Section 5 following Section 4, Section 5 to read as follows:

- Section 5 (a). Upon approval by the Board of Directors, any member not in good standing and at least or more than one year in arrears in the payment of dues may be reinstated as a member in good standing by the payment of dues in advance for at least one year from the reinstatement date plus a one dollar (\$1.00) fine, said payments to be in lieu of the payment of back dues. This part may apply EX POST FACTO.
- (b). Upon approval by the Board of Directors, a member in good standing leaving the county after March 1, 1948, who will be at least or more than one year in arrears upon his return as a resident of the county, may have the provisions of this section extended to him without the payment of the prescribed fine. A member desiring to take advantage of the provisions of this section shall so notify the President, who shall then include the subject on the agenda of the next meeting of the Board of Directors.

MINUTES OF SCCARA MEETING

23 February, 1948 43 South 3rd St. San Jose, Calif.

The meeting was called to order at 8 pm by president Stevens. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. There were no communications.

A report from the ARRL activity committee was hear from SCM Roy Pinkham, which report consisted of the RSGB proposal for phone sub-bands. It was stated that this proposal was considerably more drastic than the ARRL proposal, breaking some bands up into as many as four separate partions for CW only, CW-Phone, and Phone only. The CW only portions of five bands including the new 21 mc. band totaled 250 kc. out of a possible 3350 kc., or 7.48%, the CW-phone and phone only portions comprising the remainder. Even the most avid phone man had to admit the predjudice of this proposal. Out of the four bands now in use, the CW only portions comprised only 5.25% of the possible maximum.

The interference committee reported that procedures are being set up for BCI investigations.

Secretary Johnson called for a vote on topics pertaining to use of NBFM by club members, the information to be sent in to ARRL in reply to a request.

The amendments to the By-Laws were next considered. Amendment No. 1 passed unamimously, as amended. It now reads as follows:

Article III

Section 1. Regular meetings shall be held on the second Monday of each month.

Amendment No. 2 was then opened for considerable discussion. It was suggested, among other things, that a better solution to the problem of the reinstatement of new members would be to amend Article V, Section 2, relating to defaulting in dues, by deleting the words "in good standing". Thus a member far in arrears shall cease to become A MEMBER, and then can be readmitted ON APPROVAL OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS in the usual fashion, according to existing procedures. It was then suggested that this amendment be prepared for submission, and the proposed amendment No. 2 was tabled by unamimous vote.

Unlicensed operation was discussed at some length with particular emphasis on a known case. It was decided informally that the club should take no official action, and the matter was dropped.

Mr. Engwicht mentioned that the new SCCARA call was W6UW. further

There being no/new business, the meeting was adjourned at 9 pm. Following the meeting, a raffle of four prizes was won by two men, an exaellent ARRL training film on Cathode Ray Tubes was shown through the courtesy of Frank Quement, and coffee and donuts were enjoyed at the Spartan DoNut shop.
