

## Final Report on the SCCARA Barbeque of July 7, 1951

In my preliminary report on the BBQ at the last meeting, two days following the BBQ, I gave an approximate figure made by estimating some of the bills known to be out against the affair. Since then I have collected all money and credits and have paid all of the bills that are known: and am able to make the following report:

Raffle: \$142.50 was taken in and \$1.79 spent for a prize (this prize was put among the donated prizes out of the consigned prizes by mistake): the profit on this portion was \$140.71.

BBQ. \$652.75 was taken in on dinner donations. A total of 217 tickets were distributed for donation, of which 173 were pre-registration donations; of this amount \$1.75 was an overage possibly due to someone forgetting their change. The cost of the BBQ, which include the catering, meat, pre-registration prize dinner prize, and all other expenses connected and know was \$542.44. 217 dinners were served, of which 5 were complimentary to members of the Wieland staff present. A similar number, 5, bought tickets and failed to show up.

Dance. \$85.00 was taken in on the sales at the dance: the expenses attached, including hall rent, was \$107.83; which left us in the red \$22.83 on this portion of the affair. However, without the dance, the entire affair would not have had the finish which made the party complete: the goodwill resulting being far greater than the monetary loss. There are also several hundred paper cups left over as well as over 700 identification cards that can be put to use at later gatherings without additional expense. After the figures were computed, \$2.00 was received for soda not used at the barbeque and a credit of .12 overcharge on sales tax was received.

Now: to total up the receipts and expenses:

Total taken in including final \$2.12	882.37
Total expense	658.06
Profit to the Club	<u>\$224.31</u>

Without the cooperation received from all and particularly the work of the committee, the success of the venture would not have been possible. I again want to thank Dick Barrett for another wonderful job of publicity: Roy Couzin for his time and effort in obtaining prizes and placing tickets: Harry Smith and his entire crew who took care of the dance end: Matt Kovich, who handled the meat problem: Harry Engwicht, Frank Quement, Roy Pinkham, Harold Leigh, and Noble Hancock for their wisdom and assistance at the committee meetings and their general assistance in all departments during the collection of prices advertising and other details and last but not least, President Paul Tabbs, who acted as MC and was general messenger and man of all work, when that forgotten thing had to be done right now. The above members met weekly for about 8 weeks prior to the BBQ and we trust that future committees can profit by our mistakes-- we tried to smooth them all out ahead of time, but some crept in.

Letters of thanks to all local dealers and Bay area stores that so generously donated in a way that made the final accounting show a profit to the club, are being sent out by the Sectretary as quickly as he learns the details of their donations. Many who were not on the general committee gave a willing hand: I do not know who all are, but their efforts are fully appreciated as much as if they had been on the general committee. It is this full cooperation of everyone that put the affair over.

Amateur radiomen who have been calling "CQ" for at least 35 years may be called "super hams" after Jan. 1, by Federal ruling.

Operators in the hobby since April, 1917, who have general or advanced class ratings automatically will be awarded a newly-created "super rating" by Federal Communications Commission.

The ruling is effective Jan. 1.

While 35-year men get the rating automatically, all others have to pass a written examination and be able to send and receive messages at a very high code speed.
