



#### DIRECTIONAL 2-METER ANTENNA

The following antenna was developed by Stan Werneck, W5EF. as described in the Air Force MARS Newsletter Jan-Feb-Mar 1980. It consists of 4 20" reflectors, with spacing of 11 3/8" and a 19" radiator, mounted the same spacing in front of the middle reflector.

b= 19"
c= 20"
d= at least 38"
non-metallic mast.
