



From The ARRL Letter, December 13, 2012

ARRL FILES PETITION FOR RULEMAKING WITH FCC TO CREATE NEW MF BAND AT 472-479 KHZ

At the 2012 World Radiocommunication Conference (WRC-12), delegates approved a means of satisfying Agenda Item 1.23: a 7-kilohertz-wide secondary allocation between 472-479 kHz for the Amateur Radio Service, with a power limit of 5 W EIRP (or 1 W EIRP, depending on location). Before this portion of spectrum is made available to radio amateurs in the US, the FCC must first approve its use and amend its rules to reflect the change. As such, the ARRL filed a Petition for Rulemaking on November 29, asking the FCC to amend Parts 2 and 97 of its rules and create a domestic Amateur Radio allocation at 472-479 kHz, conforming to the allocation status and limitations set forth in the international Radio Regulations.

The Peanut

My son and I traded cars, my Camry for his Geo Metro. I couldn't stand the idea of his taking a long trip in the Metro who's motor screams at lebenty leben million RPM at a mere 55 miles per hour. Off went my mobile station, HF and UHF! This set me to work on the GEO and here is how I did it. Diamond Antenna sells antenna lip mounts that can clamp onto doors, trunk lids or in this case the hatch back. Cleverly designed to rotate in two dimensions resulting in three dimensional control over antenna verticalization. One went on the right side and the other on the left side. These have the ultra thin RG-316 coax which can sneak through closed doors with no problem. A hustler 20 meter loading coil antenna went on the right rear and a Diamond 2 Meter/70 CM antenna on the left. Inside, an ICOM IC-706MKIIG and an LDG 100 antenna tuner. Since this is a temporary installation, the radio simply sits in the right seat. The 2 Meter antenna hooks up directly, the HF antenna goes through the antenna tuner.



The final piece of the puzzle was getting power to the radio. Heavy RED/BLACK Zip cord goes from the car battery to the radio. This snakes through the engine compartment and squeezes through the right fender joint with the right door post. Temporary to be sure, but works like a charm. Anderson Power Pole connectors provide the radio with power. I can't tell you how quickly all this can be done. In any case, I was back on the air while my permanent installation is wandering around in Crested Butte Colorado. My 3PM net verified that all was well on HF and local contacts on the club

repeater confirmed the 2 Meter installation. Just love it when a plan comes together. Try it, you will like it!

The SCCARA General Membership Meeting was called to order by Fred AE6QL at 19:30, as Don was not present.

Members and three visitors introduced themselves.

Announcements:

Don K6PBQ announced the club station will be open this Saturday for the Sweepstakes Contest, from around 11am. Call on the 2m repeater to make sure he is there. Also there will be no general meeting in December: we have the Christmas luncheon on Saturday Dec. 15, 12 noon, at the Creekside Inn at 544 W. Alma. Gregg KF6FNA mentioned the gift exchange.

John Parks W6JPP announced the January speaker will be George Williams N6NKT on the Conway Reef DXpedition.

Gregg KF6FNA reported on the antenna committee activities at the Red Cross station: modifications are about 90% complete. The vertical antenna was raised 10 more feet, and the fan dipole is no longer parallel but is now usable.

Election of Officers: Fred AE6QL opened the floor to accept nominations for all officers and two director positions. There were no new nominations. Don K6PBQ moved we elect by acclamation; Joe W6SNV seconded; only Clark Murphy voted nay. The new officers are: President Fred Townsend AE6QL, Vice President John Parks W6JPP, Treasurer Goetz Brandt K6GKB, Secretary Viki Moldenhauer K16WDS, Director Gregg Lane KF6FNA, and Director Clark Murphy KE6KXO.

The evening's speaker was Eric Schwartz WA6HHQ, CEO of Elecraft. He brought new toys and a slide presentation. He shared some of the adventures of running and growing a successful business with products assembled and tested in the US. He demonstrated some of the new products: the KX3 Transceiver, XG-3 Signal Generator, KPA-500K 500 W amp, KAT-500 autotuner, and K3-zero (no RF!. Attendance: President: ; Vice President: Fred Townsend AE6QL; Secretary: Viki Moldenhauer KI6WDS; Treasurer: Goetz Brandt K6GKB; Trustee: Don Village K6PBQ; Directors: Lou Steirer WA6QYS, Wally Britten KA6YMD, Gary Mitchell WB6YRU; Visitors: Clark Murphy KE6KXO; Absent: President Don Steinbach AE6PM, Directors John Glass NU6P and Gregg Lane KF6FNA (all excused).

Agenda additions were discussed.

Announcements:

Director Gregg Lane is out of town and requests an excused absence. The SCCARA President Fred AE6QL will be on an overseas mission for the month of January and requests an excused absence; John W6JPP will run the meetings.

The SVECS Quarterly Breakfast is on Saturday January 26 2013.

The club station will be open Saturday January 26 2013. People should call on the repeater to make sure Don K6PBQ is at the station.

Secretary's report: Viki KI6WDS explained about the still-ongoing work crunch preventing her getting the November minutes into the newsletter. Copies of the October Roster were passed out. Don K6PBQ moved to approve the October minutes published in the SCCARAGRAM; Wally KA6YMD seconded; the motion carried unanimously.

Treasurer's report: Goetz K6GKB handed out copies of the treasurer's report: Checking = \$4621.70, Savings = \$500.07, Cash = \$375.65, Total = \$5497.42. Lou WA6QYS moved to approve the treasurer's report; Don K6PBQ seconded, motion carried.

Newsletter Contributions: Goetz K6GKB has some in the works but would welcome more Work-In-Progress topics from members.

Station Trustee's report: Don K6PBQ announced that John W6JPP will run the net next Monday night. Don received AMSAT literature, which will be kept at the club station. Regarding the Christmas party, 25 people attended (last year we had 26). Clark KE6KXO proposed changing the site to Holder's Country Inn: Lou volunteered Gwen and himself to help Don check out the restaurant after Jan 1; Don will take a site change for next year under advisement.

Regarding Field Day, Don K6PBQwill get reservations for Jun 21 and 22 (Fri and Sat nights) at Mt. Madonna campground as a backup location.

Regarding club station hours, discussion was held about a regular notice in the newsletter announcing the club hours (the last Saturday of the month, opening somewhere between 10 and 11am, until mid-afternoon; call on the repeater to be sure he is there). Don also apologized for accidentally dropping the club 440 radio, and wanted to reiterate we should not encourage bringing personal equipment to club events like Field Day, because accidents do happen. The squelch knob is broken and display does not come on. Goetz suggested Kuni at Comtek repair in Poulsbo WA as excellent at repairing radios. Don will send it in for repair after the first of the year.

Regarding the Club license, it is up for renewal in April of 2014.

Don passed around a QSL card the club station received for K3WI in Delaware (a harder state to get).

Don also mentioned that Doug Pietrock AF6CI would like to donate a Kenwood TS440 with separate tuner (condition unknown) to the club. He says it is better than the Kenwood 140 from the Children's Museum. Don will contact Doug to accept it: if we decide we don't need it we will return it so he can sell it.

Clarke KE6KXO described a very large possible donation: Channel 11 has a truck with a big antenna available. The club would have to consider liability, insurance, and license. It has been sitting for 2-3 years. There is a possibility of parking it at the Red Cross. Sharing it with RACES, and licensing with the City of San Jose need to be explored.

Vice President's report: John W6JPP has the speakers lined up for the first 6 months. January's speaker will be George Williams N6NKT, on the relationship between the Red Cross and Amateur Radio, and the DXpedition to Conway Reef.

President's report: Fred AE6QL, per the by-laws, reappointed all

standing committees. He also appointed John W6JPP to head the Field Day location recommendation committee: send him any suggestions. As Fred will be gone the month of January, he reminded board members that notifying the President, or Secretary, or any 2 members of the board of an absence is necessary for it to be an excused absence. The board is allowed to meet over the radio, or the internet, or by email: once we had a board meeting over the repeater. A board member can make a motion in email for an upcoming meeting, and anyone not present for a vote is counted as a negative.

Fred presented a Presidential Challenge to the board: to come up with one thing to improve SCCARA: He will ask in future meetings. Fred's preferred email is ae6ql@arrl.net (which forwards to the not-yet-up new email).

The President's Column for February will be on Field Day. He suggested having Don as station Trustee bring a radio to a club meeting and demo it or some particular feature, like auto tuner, DSP, pre-selector, noise blanking. Don will enlist help to transport equipment. Fred would like to start with the February meeting.

Newsletter/BBS report: Gary WB6YRU needs newsletter submissions by Monday Dec. 31. He also needs a replacement photo of the president: Fred has one on the way. Gary got another radio for the 220 port of the BBS and wired up the TNC: the forwarding ports are being worked on (squelch not opening fast enough, so he is converting to open squelch; parts are on order.). More emergency BBS are joining in the area (as this is considered an encrypted communication), so there is more forwarding happening.

Repeater/webpage Report: Wally WA6YMD has nothing to report.

Special Committees: A Field Day chairman appointment is pending. Fred raised questions of how to make it easier to do: beams vs. wire antennas, a Windom for the GOTA station. Towers were discussed: the crank-up tower and the lighter aluminum tower are better solutions to the big heavy 2-piece triangle tower. Batteries were also discussed: changing from the heavy batteries and battery chargers to switching power supplies with current-limiting protection and better quality power. Fred observed keying down drops a battery voltage by 0.5V, but only 50mV on the switching power supplies.

Fred AE6QL adjourned the meeting at 21:26.
